More than a decade of FRench and American rivalry was apparently replaced today - with a new "spirit of Martinique." President Ford and French President Giscard D'Estaing - ending their three day summit with a joint communique pledging to work together on financial matters, - buffende defense, global disarmament, -and especially oil; in the same vein com xunix urging a conference of world leaders from all representing the major oil consuming nations, and the less developed nations, and the major oil producers. The French also agreeing to pay the US a hundred million - in compensation for added costs resulting from French withdrawal from Nato. All of which is said be to herald a new era - in French and American friendship. Secretary Kissinger for one, saying we are no longer "antagonists - but allies."

In Washington the House has finally yielded;
accepting the Senate measure; nullifying its previous
