KISSINGER

On the peace front Henry Kissinger reported to President Nixon today on the latest from Paris. The White House as usual - refusing to discuss what was said - how - why - or anything.

Back in Paris though - Hanoi's Le Duc Tho was telling reporters - "there still are many difficult things to be settled." When asked for comment on this - the White House reaction was: "You could assume - we would challenge Le Duc Tho's statement!"

VIETNAM

Meanwhile, enemy troops were over-running a former Green Beret camp - in the Central Highlands of South Vietnam. Then turning their guns on a nearby range base, in an attempt apparently to crack the defense shield around the provincial capitals of Pleiku and Kontum.

In the air war, U S F-One -Eleven jets were hitting targets within ten miles of Hanoi.

WHITE HOUSE FOLLOW SEATTLE

From the White House comes word that President Nixon will be on the air again this Sunday. We hear he'll discuss problems of crime and drug abuse and what his administration has done to deal with them."

The President also sent a message to Congress today along with the fourth quarterly report from his Cost-of-Living Council. In it he says the year old wage and price control program " has achieved solid gains;" both in revitaliz^{ing}~~ation~~ our economy" - said he - "and stemming the erosion of the value of the dollar."

SEATTLE

On the West Coast - Senator McGovern was continuing his campaign at Seattle - with a "throw the rascals out" speech. Charging the administration with "serving money more than people." Adding that "special favors" - are "flowing like Niagara."

Next stop - Portland, then San Francisco - and on to San Diego.

SENATE

On Capitol Hill - the Senate, ^{today} finally
approved and sent along to the White House, ~~today~~
President Nixon's long sought revenue sharing bill.
This calling for federal allocations to state and
local government - totally more than five billion
the first year; in all - more than thirty billion
over a period of five years.

MANILA

Two American priests serving as missionaries in the Philippines - have been arrested and placed in detention camps. The announcement - coming today from Manila.

The Reverend Father Bruno Hicks - accused of "inciting to rebellion." While the Reverend Father John Peterson - was accused of making unauthorized radio broadcasts in defiance of martial law.

SAN FRANCISCO

After four years in the hot seat - Dr. ~~S~~ Hayakawa resigned today as President of San Francisco State University. At age sixty-six - moving on to greener pastures. Gone - but not soon to be forgotten; as witness a tribute - from University Chancellor Glen Dumke.

President Hayakawa assumed office said he - at a most difficult period and with a specific assignment - to bring peace and order to a troubled campus. Dumke adding: "He not only accomplished this objective with effectiveness and dispatch - but in so doing became a national symbol of the turning point in campus violence."
