UNITED NATIONS

At the United Nations here in New York -

Red China was soundly rebuffed again today; making it eighteen straight years -- that the U.N. General Assembly has refused to hand over China's seat to Peking. Indeed, the Nationalist Chinese picking up two votes over last year -- in retaining their place at the U.N.

The world body also rejecting for the second straight year -- a possible "two China" solution to the problem. Turning next to an item -- strongly supported by the Soviet Union, An item citing the "need for accelerating the definition of aggression - in the light of the present international situation;" namely -- Vietnam.

OTTAWA

From Paris to Jerusalem to Ottawa -- and most points between - a chorus of protests today; over DeGaulle's latest attack - against the U.S. Dollar, against Israel, against Britain, against Canada, against you-name-it.

Israel, for one - ~~thrust~~ threatening to withdraw its ambassador from Paris. As for Canadian Prime Minister Lester Pearson - he called DeGaulle's interference in Canadian affairs simply "intolerable."

While Britain was refusing to accept as final - DeGaulle's apparent veto of British membership in the Common Market.

At the same time -- perhaps the sharpest criticism of all coming right from Paris; where the influential Paris newspaper Le Monde called DeGaulle a "Machiavellan genius - with an insatiable lust for power."

McNAMARA

After seven years of ^{indefatigable zeal} ~~matchless performance~~

Robert Strange McNamara is preparing to step down as Secretary of Defense. This the inside word today from the Pentagon -- as you may have heard by now.

Though nothing official as yet - ~~Robert~~ McNamara ^{indeed} is expected to become the new President of the World Bank; as soon as bank directors can formally vote on the matter -- probably tomorrow.

On Capitol Hill - the news drawing mixed reaction. However, Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield -- perhaps expressing the prevailing viewpoint, when he called the defense chief - the best man in the Cabinet; the "one" -- said he -- "we can least afford to lose."

Next question: Who then will take McNamara's place? Best bet so far: Retiring Governor John Connally of Texas -- a longtime friend of the President and also a former Secretary of the Navy.

Could this have political overtones? Election year and all that? Many are asking.

MCCARTHY

Elsewhere on the political front - Senator

*McCarthy of Wisconsin made it official today; or almost
anyway. Democrat McCarthy saying he will probably
announce his Presidential candidacy -- as of this Thursday.
The only question - said he -- which primaries he will
enter.*

Meanwhile, in Lansing, Michigan - McCarthy

*was already winning the support of Zoltan Ferency; who
resigned today as Michigan Democratic Chairman - rather
than support President Johnson *for re-nomination.**

VIETNAM

War news from Saigon - a story today of hit-and-run raids from the Northern provinces all the way to the Mekong Delta. Enemy forces concentrating their fire solely on South Vietnamese installations -- including a number of air fields, a naval base, a ~~pass~~ power plant and a district police headquarters. The Viet Cong apparently still gun-shy of American troops -- after the ~~terrible~~^{heavy} losses they suffered in that disastrous Highland campaign.

Sometimes hard to believe from day-to-day news reports - but the war in Vietnam - will ~~be over~~ ^{end} some day - as ~~are~~ ^{must} all wars; ^{even the "100 yrs War"} - all ^A which accounts for a new program just getting under way -- at major American military bases. It's called - "Operation Transition." Its main purpose - to assure men leaving the service ^{that} they will have worthwhile jobs ^{when they get again into} ~~again~~ ^{back} ~~to~~ civilian life.
