But their atomic scientists, according to Snell, are now daptives in Moscow, tortured to make them reveal all they know about atomic energy.

many supposed to be rockets flying around are not rockets at all -- but meteors. The first word about the strange missiles came from Sweder, and it seemed likely enough that the Soviets might be conducting the rocket experiments over the Baltic Sea in the direction of Sweder. However, we've been having, since then, a whole swarm of reports, about rockets -- in various parts of Europe, even in North Africa. These hardly seemed plausible, and now we have a suggested explanation -- meteors.

In England, Dr. Alan Hunter of the Royal Observatory of Greenwich, states that he has received word from Swedish astronomers that they are now discounting the rocket theory. They point out that, in fact, no fragments of rockets have been found, and the strange flashing bings might well have been meteors -- which burned themselves up in the atmosphere of the earth.

The astronomers point out that right now is

a great time for meterors. In August, the annual swarm of perseids came along, according to schedule. Still more significantly, the earth is now approaching the Giacobini-Zinner Comet, which heavenly body will be a spectacular sight about a week from now. The approach of a comet often produces a meteor shower -- the earth picking up fragments of the comet.

In Berlin today, there were demonstrations against the acquittal of three of the Nuremberg defendants, Schacht, Von Papen and Fritsche. Thousands of Germans, some of them carrying Red Flags, marched through the streets and shouted -- "Hang them all."

The demonstration was sponsored by the Red Party in Berlin, and followed the Soviet line -- which protests against the acquittals.

The latest from Nuremberg is that the executions will be carried out not by the British hangman, but by an American. The Army over there has an official executioner, who has hanged a number of Nazi atrocity criminals -- and he, assisted by a German, will probably preside over the doom of the Nazi war-makers.
