In Washington today, Maval officers were warned to be more careful about saluting high civilian officials. The story is going around that recently the President, on a morning stroll, encountered a Waval officer, and greeted him with a friendly "Hello".

A Navy spokesman stated today that Navy officials do not know of any such insult, and denied that today's order for salutes to civilian officials was brought about by an officer turning his back on the President.
