Czechoslovakia and so on.

#### PEKING FOLLOW RED CHINA

At the same time Radio Peking today was accusing the United States- of escalating anew the war in Vietnam; of doing so - in league with the Soviet Union. This in a broadcast in response to the intrusion of those two U S Navy planes - over Chinese air space.

The alleged escalation formulated - said Peking at that Glassboro summit meeting between President Johnson and Soviet Premier Kosygin. The two statesmen accused of plotting the defeat of North Vietnam - either by bombing it into submission - or forcing it to the peace table.

At that though - Peking made no mention of possible counteraction. And those who heard the xo broadcast - saying it contained no"grave or threatening" tone.

### VIETNAM FOLLOW PEKING

From Saigon comes news today - of two major ground actions in South Vietnam.

The first - in the North - near the D M Z where a three truck Marine convoy -- was ambushed by an estimated twenty-five hundred Viet Cong. Of the marines - five killed, thirty-four, wounded and only about five escaping unscathed. The enemy paying, however, with the loss of more than a hundred men - mainly to U S air and artillery fire.

The second battle - to the south - in the Mekong delta, Where a combined US Army-Navy River assault team - flushed from hiding a large force of Viet Cing. Again, American air and artillery fire accounting for the lion's share - of nearly eighty enemy dead.

### ADD VIETNAM FOLLOW PEKING

As for that South Vietnamese political race a letter today from Premier Ky to the National Congress; in which Ky asserted his government is running a clean election - and does not need a lesson in honesty from anyone. **That** The Premier adding - he will "readily accept" the verdict of the people two weeks hence.

### SENATE FOLLOW VIETNAM

On the home front - another defense today of US bombing policy in the battle zone. This time - from Air Force Chief of Staff General John McConnell; who told a Senate sub-committee that eight hundred thousand additional American troops - might have been needed in Vietnam; if U.S. bombers - had not been allowed to hit the Communist North.

General McConnell further calling the air war over Vietnam -- a "controlled air campaign;" despite the downing yesterday or two off-course American planes -over Red China. A "controlled air campaign" - said he that had clearly restricted the build-up of enemy men and supplies in the South. The General adding that "air power exerts the influence - that is most likely to force the enemy to reconsider his avowed hard line."

### MIDDLE EAST

In the Middle East - Israel served notice once more todates the has no intention of surrendering the old city of Jerusalem 4 captured from Jordan in that lightning

blitz last June.

This at a formal ceremony - in the Israeli Foreign Office at Jerusalem, Stensibly welcoming to the Middle East - UN special Envoy Ernesto Thalmann of Switzerland, But serving instead as still another reminderof the seemingly insoluble Arab and Israeli impasse.

Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban telling Thalmann - that "a new dramatic change" has occurred in Jerusalem. "Where there has been division" - said he -"there is now unity; where there has been aftense military frontier - there is now peace and security; where there has been desecration, sacrilege, obstruction to access and assertion of unilateral exclusive control over holy places - there is now, for the first time in history, a disposition to bring the holy places under the responsibility

### CAIRO FOLLOW MIDDLE EAST

While from Cairo - a report today that Egypt's Colonel Nasser is equally adamant in purpose. Supposedly vowing to keep the Suez Canal closed - 'till all Israeli troops are withdrawn completely - from all occupied Arab territory.

#### BRUSSELS

From Brussels - news today of the tragic death of three young Belgian tourists; after they strayed accidentally - into the strife-torn Congo.

The three young men - traveling by car from Kenya to Rwanda; when they made the mistake of crossing the Congo border. Congolese soldiers immediately taking them into custody - as suspected white mercenaries.

Informed later of the capture - the Belgian Foreign Ministry quickly lodging a diplomatic appeal - but too late. The three youths - had already been shot. Raising to more than four hundred - the number of Belgians killed in the Congo since Nineteen Sixty.

#### LAS VEGAS

Chances of man setting off a natural earthquake -- by means of an underground nuclear explosion - virtually nil; according to a reassuring report today - from the Atomic Energy Commission office in Las Vegas.

The A E C admitting a "remote possibility" that an underground atomic blast "might be followed by an earthquake - which was on the verge of occurring anyway." However, the report adding: "There is no known instance of a natural earthquake -- being triggered by a man-made explosion."

### PHILADELPHIA

Results of a six month medical study - were amnounced today in Philadelphia. Predicting that ambulances will soon give way to helicopters -- in transporting traffic accident victims to hospitals.

The report based, in part on the increasing difficulty that ambulances encounter - trying to reach the scene of an accident, This - because of traffic jams. where a helicopter could drop right in - pick up the patient - and deliver him quickly, safely to a hospital; permitting was early treatment - that could well mean the difference between life and death.

The study adding that most hospitals already have built-in-heliports -- such as grassy lawns or flat rooftops. Also that most are more than willing - to participate in a helicopter ambulance plan. The only question - they say - who shall own and aprae operate the

aircraft.

#### WEST BERLIN
