Angry Communist Chinese diplomats ^{charged} ~~surged~~

out of their legation in London today to attack policemen with axes and baseball bats. About thirty Chinese - enraged after arguing with police about parking a car - battled the London Bobbies who fought back with their night sticks - using the lids of garbage cans to ward off bottles and other flying missiles. The wounded casualties were three policemen -- a press photographer -- and three Chinese diplomats who still clutched copies of the book -- "the thoughts of Chairman Mao" -- as they were carried away on stretchers.

Colony of Hong Kong. Police shot and killed a man during a pitched battle with Communist-inspired rioters.

CHINA VIET

Communist China has renewed its pledge to continue making "the biggest national sacrifices" in support of the Viet Cong forces in the Vietnamese war.

The pledge came in an editorial - published in the official Peking people's Daily -- also accusing the Soviet Union of collaborating with the United States to sell out the Vietnamese Communists.

VIETNAM

~~American authorities in Saigon have announced~~
~~a record number of sixteen plane losses for one week of~~
~~air action over North Viet Nam.~~ In the South, the
Communists continued their terror campaign in an effort
to disrupt next Sunday's national elections. In Saigon's
Chinese district, a South Vietnamese naval officer
was shot to death by two terrorists who fired from a
bicycle. The officer was handing out leaflets, urging
the people to vote on Sunday.

REFUGEES

Israel reversed its stand today and extended, for an indefinite period, the deadline for ~~some~~ Jordanian refugees to return to the Israeli-occupied West Bank of the Jordan River. The surprise announcement paves the way for the return of ^{some} ~~about~~ ten thousand refugees whose applications have been approved by the Israeli government. Thousands of Arabs fled across the Jordan River during last June's Arab-Israeli War.

AUTOS

The Big Three car-makers have presented the United Auto Workers with a contract offer - providing pay raises of from thirty-three to fifty-one cents an hour. The union's executive board will meet tomorrow and Thursday to consider the offer, ^{which we are told will be} ~~but it's certain to be~~ rejected, ^{because} ~~virtually ignored~~ two of the union's ~~biggest~~ ^{were passed over -} biggest demands - a U.S. pay scale for Canadian auto workers -- and the abolishment of hourly wages in favor of guaranteed annual salaries. The union has set a strike deadline for September Sixth -- unless a contract agreement is reached by that time.

POVERTY

A five and a half billion dollar bill to finance the fight against poverty - approved today by the Senate Labor Committee. The measure includes an emergency job program of nearly three billion dollars for racial ghettos in the larger cities - a program which the Johnson administration opposes. This could bring on a floor fight when the bill comes up for debate.

Republican leaders in Congress say the time has come to - as they put it -- ^{to} "slam the door, and slam it hard" on Black Power leaders Rap Brown and Stokely Carmichael. Senator Dirksen of Illinois and Congressman Gerald Ford of Michigan joined in calling for greater protection for law-abiding citizens. They accused the Johnson administration of heading into full retreat in the war against crime.

ELECTION

Voters turned out in heavy numbers in Mississippi today to cast ballots in a hotly contested race for the gubernatorial nomination and a major bid for political power by negro candidates. Twenty-two negroes are involved in Democratic primary run-offs for various county, district and legislative offices.

SHIRLEY

Former child movie star Shirley Temple has ~~now~~ decided to run for Congress in California on the Republican ticket. She announced her candidacy today at ~~xxxxxx~~ a news conference in San Mateo, saying, "it will be an uphill effort - I'm getting a late start because nine men are already in the race." The darling of such ~~pa~~ films as "The Good Ship Lollipop" and "The Little Colonel" will face her male opponents in a special congressional election on November fourteenth. The thirty-nine year old former actress says her campaign slogan will be-- "all the way with L B J has gotten us in the shape we're in today."

NAZIS

Several uniformed members of the American Nazi party -- all wearing Swastika arm bands and screaming "Heil Hitler" -- tried to storm their way through a line of military police at a cemetery today.

And - as a result - the army has withdrawn permission for the Nazis to bury their slain leader - George Lincoln Rockwell - in the Culpeper, Virginia, National Cemetery.

The Nazis refused to comply with the Army's requirement that all Nazi emblems had to be removed from the uniforms ~~before~~ before entering the cemetery. The haggling went on for hours, with ^{these local} ~~the~~ Nazis refusing to comply. Finally, the Army announced its decision to withdraw permission for the burial. Rockwell's body was returned to American Nazi Party headquarters in Arlington, Virginia, ~~no~~ with no announcement was made concerning future burial plans.

TEACHER

In Philadelphia, a judge has placed a former Villanova university English instructor on probation for one year. Twenty-eight year old William Lupton was accused of running through the streets near his home ~~on~~ last December, wearing nothing but his handle bar mustache while allegedly under the influence of L S D. Police grabbed Lupton as he ran screaming down the street, wildly waving his arms as he was being chased by his wife -- who was clad only in a trench-coat.

INDIA

Vast stretches of northern India are under water today. Hundreds of thousands left homeless by rampaging flood waters -- spawned by a full week of heavy rains. At least twenty ~~1000~~ nine are known drowned in Uttar Pradesh State where some twenty-six thousand mud-huts were reported washed away by the flooded rivers.

STORM

Storm warnings - hoisted along the Pacific

FIRES

Scores of forest fires continue to rage unchecked in Oregon tonight. New blazes - fanned by high winds - have broken out in the forest lands of British Columbia. And beleaguered Idaho has renewed its appeal for federal aid. Some progress was reported in fighting the fires in Washington State and Idaho, but most were still out of control. More than one hundred-fifty thousand acres of scenic lands have been blackened in five states and British Columbia in the past three weeks.
