A new step toward possible victory in Vietnam was unveiled publicly for the first time today in Washington.

Defense Secretary McNamara disclosing plans for construction of a so-called - "strip of death" between North and South Vietnam. A barrier of so-called "highly sophisticated" detection devices - hopefully to curbing the influx of enemy troops. Will it do so?

Construction of the first stretch has already begun said Defense Secretary McNamara. This in a fifteen-mile
clearing - along the Vietnamese coastal plain. Just how
long the barrier will be in its entirety - and what those
"highly sophisticated" detection devices will be - he did not
say. His point being - "the more the enemy knows about
our plans - the more ready he could be to defeat the system."

Secretary McNamara also unleashed the strongest

administration Reaction charges by Michigan Governor Romney - that he had been "brainashed" about

the war in Vietnam; farthern that the American people

were being misled - about the true facts of the war.

Said Robert McNamara: "I don't think Governor Romney can recognize the truth - when he sees it or hears it." The Secretary adding that Romney - "appears to be blind to the truth."

CRITICS FOLLOW ROMNEY

Elsewhere in Washington - and, indeed, around the nation - more of the same. Republicans and Democrats alike joining today - in often harsh criticism of Romney brainwashing" charge.

On the Republican side - most obvious reaction at a meeting of Republican State Chairmen in Washington.

Party leaders admitting that reaction to Romney's statement - had "not been good." The Nixon-for-President camp saying Romney had miss displayed certain "weaknesses" on the Vietnam issue -- that could well embarrass him in sixty-eight. Pennsylvania se Republicans also announcing plans for a new poll - to reaccess Romney's chances of beating President Johnson.

However, the unkindest cut of all - from

National Democratic Chairman John Bailey - who said:

"Governor Romney's statements this week - have proved

that anybody who tried to brainwash the Governor - has

very little to work with."

VIETNAM FOLLOW CRITICS

bloodiest battles of the war, US Marines today hurling back a force of four thousand Viet Cong - in a force twenty hour clash near Da Nang. The fighting - Much hand to hand at times - leaving nearly four hundred enemy dead.

Marine officers later saying the US victory -had clearly cut short a major Viet Cong offensive; one
apparently aimed at capturing complete control - of all
the northern provinces.

In Detroit - tiery tongued Walter Reuther was strangely silent today - a victim of laryngitis; the result of marathon contract talks - with the Ford Motor Company.

For the moment though - no need for speeches.

About a hundred and sixty thousand of Reuther's auto

workers, doing their talking with picket signs; in the

first nationwide auto strike - in three years.

As for management - Henry Ford-the-Second today called the strike - "totally unjustified and completely unnecessary." Further demanding new laws to halt what he called - "this kind of bludgeon against the public interest."

All of which - points to a long strike. Indeed, abready have keen negotiations suspended - until Monday at the earliest.

For the third straight day - a series of sharp gun duels today across that uneasy Middle East truce line. Israeli forces trading fire with Egyptians at the Suez Canal - with Jordanians at the Jordan River. Although casualties were said to be light - Egypt reporting heavy property damage.

In the wake of the fighting - Jerusalem again charging the Arabs were responsible. Calling the daily skirmishes - a smokescreen for Arab feuding. Reports from Lebanon - bolstering the Israeli charge. With Beirut newspapers reporting today that President Noureddin Atassi of Syria - has almost certainly been overthrown.

Meanwhile, Israeli Premier Levi Eshkil was visiting the Canal Zone today. There noting pointedly that Arab leaders meeting last week at Khartoum - were still dead-set against recognizing Israel; still dead-set - against a negotiated peace.

Barred from Aden by federal army troops warring Arab nationalists took their blood - feud into
the surrounding countryside today. The militant national
Liberation front and rival flosy - battling in a hundredand-ten degree desert heat; to see which will control the
Federation of South Arabia - when the British leave in
January.

In the meantime - efforts to end the fighting are centered mainly in Cairo. Leaders of the Liberation Front - which appears to hold the upper hand - appealing directly to Egypt's Cotonet Nasser; asking him to withdraw his support of Flosy forces - in the name of Arab unity.

A three-man united nations mission also in Cairo - to meet Saturday with Flosy kandows leaders in search of a possible compromise.

French President Charles DeGaulle conferred

for more than two hours todes - with Polish President

Ochab and Premier Cyrankiewicz. This his only scheduled

meeting with the Polish leaders - before departing Warsaw

for a tour of the provinces. But what they talked about -

At the same time - DeGaulle again demonstrating he's nobody's new puppet. According to French sources - DeGaulle trying to arrange a meeting with Stefan Cardinal Wyszynski; the Roman Catholic Primate of Poland -- who has been feuding with Communist authorities for years.

The meeting - barred in the end - we're told. However, DeGaulle reportedly receiving a letter and a religious gift from the Cardinal - in appreciation for the effort.
