The White House - President Johnson confermed with President-elect Nixon. The latter flying to Washington to after a brief wastion vacation at Key Biscayne. L B J and members of his cabinet were waiting to brief Richard Nixon on Vietnam, Nato, Eastern Europe, and the Middle East and so on.

The President later telling newsmen he intends to "do everything possible - to help the new President and LBT put it: - with the burdens he is assuming in behalf of all of us."
