Herenold Senator McCarthy of Minnesota
made it official today. Announcing plans to oppose President

Johnson -- in at least four Democratic Presidential primaries next year.

McCarthy declaring himself -- not a peace candidate but rather an "anti-war" candidate. His main concern -- said he .that the Johnson Administration seems to have set no limits
-- on the price it will pay for military victory in Vietnam.

## MCNAMARA

Elsewhere in Washington -- Robert McNamara's nomination as president of the World Bank -- still the chief topic of cloakroom conversation. Rumors persists ing that the Defense Chief was "eased out" -- because of his opposition to escalation of the war in Vietnam; a charge which the White House again branded today -- pure "nonsense."

General Earle Wheeler -- Chairman of the Joint Chiefs
of Staff -- also joining today in debunking that escalation
rumor. Asserting "there is no intention or plan" -- to depart
from present strategy in Vietnam. The enemy can expect only
"more of the same" -- is the way he summed it up.
