PALESTINE

More hostilities in Palestine, today. Minor incidents but always dangerous.

Israel states that both Syria and Egypt fired at Israeli planes. Syrian ground batteries making a hit. Damaging a light plane - and injuring its pilot. The plane forced down inside the Israeli Line.

Along the Gaza Strip, Egyptian guns shot at a couple of Israeli Jet Fighters - but no hits were scored. Egyptians declare - the Jets were on the Ehyptian side of the Border. Which Israel denies.

On the ground, there was an exchange of gunfire along the Border of the Gaza Strip. And Israel charges that infi infiltrators from Jordan tried to wreck a train - running between Jerusalem and Tel Aviv.

Further incidents - following a clash yesterday, along

the sea of Galilee. Where Syrian guns fired on two Israeli Police boats, At least three Israeli were killed.

Israel - protesting to the Security Council of the U.N.

BRITAIN-JORDAN

Britain is retaliating against Jordan for the abrupt firing of Lieutenant General John Glubb, The legended Glubb Pasha, so long the Commander of the Arab Legion, His dismissal - taken as a sign that Jordas has broken away from British guidance.

Today, in London, Prime Minister Anthony Eden told A Parliament that fifteen Britist Officers are being recalled from the Arab Legion. Officers - in key positions. The London Government no longer permitting them to serve the Kingdom of Jordan. Fifty to sixty other Britist officers "holding lesser posts" are not being withdrawn.

Today, Queen Elizabeth knighted Glubb Pasha. The creator of the Arab Legion - appointed a Knight Commander of net Siz Shift. He The Order Of The Bath. So Glubb Pasha now becomes Sir John dlubb, Nd. C. B. BRITAIN-CYPRUS

Ftrouble

Negotiations for a settlement on the island of Cyprus have broken down. So stated in the London House Of Commons today. Colonial Secretary Alan Lenox-Boyd announcing - the failure of negotiations with orthodox Archbishop Makarios, leader of the agitation for a Union Of Cyprus and Greece.

The British offered a scheme of self government, but the Archbishop demanded that the control of the Police should be handed over. Also, more amnestites for prisoners than the British are willing to concede. Offer of self government rejected. The British made a move tonight, without precedent;jamming the Athens radio - to blackout propaganda broadcasts from Greece. Not even during world war two did the British Governemtn practice radio jamming -- not even when Hitler px propaganda was beamed into Britain. But now the London Governemtn announces jamming to keep Athens propaganda out of Cyprus. CHURCHILL

Fulton, Missouri, today sent a cablegram to Sir Winston Churchill. Informing him, that he has been make an Honorary Citizen of the Missouri town. All of which is appropriate; today being the tenth anniversary of that famous "Iron Curtain" Address, Given at Westminister College, in Fulton.

On March Fifth, Nineteen Forty-six, an expression was coined which has become worldwide. Picturing the sinister secrecy of Russian Communist, Churchill said.

"From Stettin in the Baltic, to Trieste in the Adriatic an Iron Curtain has descended across the Continent."

Always interesting to note - how a familiar expression originates.

ROMANIA

A reigh of Red Terror is reported in Romania. Anti-Communists in West Germany say they have the accounts from refugees, So unbelievable, they had to be double checked. Accounts of executions by the hundreds. The Reign of Terror going on for months, if the sensational accounts turn out to be true. We, in America , have just got over our burning question to run or not to run; and now South Korea has a similar puzzle, concerning a President - seeking, or not seeking another term.

Synfgman Rhee has been nominated - but will he accept the nomination. His Liberal Party named him, unanimously, to run for a fourth term. But the eighty year old Syngman Rhee, today, stated "I have decided not to run this year."

However, he went on to tell his Liberal Party supporters -"to collect public opinion", about their choice for a candidate. And the belief is that he expects public opinion to say ----Syngman Rhee.

An opposition leader declares ... "It is apparent - that the President intends to muster support from the whole public."

Critics have been saying - that syngman Rhee wants to

remain President for the rest of his life. But he doesn't want to give that appearance. So they now say he's trying to

maneuver a draft.

FUJIYAMA

In Japan, a U.S. Air Force Cargo Plane crashed into Fujiyama. The plane hitting about a thousand feet below the summit of the far famed mountain. Casualties ... well, there were only two men aboard, and they both climed out, with minor bruises. Answer - the snow. The summit of Fujiyama - covered with enormous drifts. The Cargo Plane - landing in twenty feet of soft, powdery snow. The two survivors made their way through the snow, to a

Japanese Weather Station - high up on Fujiyama.

HONDURAS

Here's a transaction involving fifty million acres, including the entire Atlantic Coast of Honduras.

Seems like a lot of real estate for anybody to buy. But it's a case of Oil Rights.

A company consisting of Hondurans and Texas oil men has obtained a concession to fourteen million acres on land, and Thirty-six million acres off shore.

They've already brought in an oil well, as a test. Now, an imperiate enormous concession Honduras. CHIEFS OF STAFF.

Washington announces that the Joint Chiefs of Staff are in Puerto Rico. Heads of the Army, Navy and Air Force conferring secretly on pressing military matters, like the "New Look" of American Armed Forces in this Atemic Age. But why Puerto Rico ? Well, they are meeting at The Ramey Air Force Base, for seclusion. So they can devote their full time all this week to secret conferences without interruption. The Lobbyist Lawyer, John W. Neff, is back in the news. And, again, the figure is twenty-five hundred dollars. That sum - offered to the campaign fund of Semator Hickenlooper of lows.

Recalling that previous headline - the twenty-five hundred dollar offer of Lawyer Neff to Semator Case of South Dakota. In connection with the Natural Cas Bill, which was passed, but vetoed by President Eisenhower, on the ground of "arrogant" lobbying activities.

Today, Weff admitted the twenty-five hundred dollar offer to Semator Hickenlooper's campaign fund. If, the Semator was in favor of the Natural Gas Bill. The proposal was placed before Wendell Edson, an Iowa lawyer, who, testifying today, said he rejected the twenty-five hundred dollars. He told Weff - LOBBYIST (2)

Senator Hickenlooper would be shocked, if he ever heard about the offer.

All this developed before a Senate Committee, which is investigating the business of Lobbying. Particularly in connection with the Natural Gas Bill.

Senator Goldwater of Arizona, a committee member, says he got a campaign contribution of two-hundred-and-fifty dollars from a man named Keck. But who is Keck?

In the twenty-five hundred dollar offer to Senator Case, the money was to have come from the funds of Howard Keck of California, President of the Superior Oil Company. But Senator Goldwater says he thinks his contributor was Bill Keck, of Chicago. It now turns out that oil man Howard Keck has a brother named Bill. His father, Chairman of the Board of LOBBYIST (3)

Superior Oil, is also named Bill.

However, the confusion in names increases with a report from the Arizona Secretary of State, who says - a two-hundredand-fifty dollar contribution to the Goldwater campaign fund was made by Matthew Keck. The donation - duly reported by the Senator's campaign committee.

All - a bit intricate.

SEGRATION

Here's a Supreme Court verdict with an important meaning in the affairs of segregation at the University of Alabama. And - at all other Southern Colleges and Universities.

The Court rules - that it's ban on racial segregation in Public Schools also apples to institutions of higher education - Which are supported by taxes.

The decision comes in a case conderning the University Of North Carolina. Three Negro youths - demanding Heat admission. Academic officials argued a the Supreme Court ruling against racial segregation in Public Schools, did not apply to Colleges and Universities. A Lower Court said - it did.

And now the high tribunal - affirms that opinion.

The last of the big-time Communist fugitives came in, today, and surrendered. Henry Winston, the Negro leader trained in Moscow, who had been missing for five years.

In Nineteen Fifty-one, eleven members of the American Politburo were to have begun prison sentences, five years each. Seven did - but four vanished. In time, two of the fugitives were captured. Two - remaining at large.

Last week, Gilbert Green surrendered - willing to serve his prison term. Now - Henry Winston, Wio, today - made his appearance at the Federal Courthouse in New York.

He said - he had been in hiding, so that he could fight against a Fascist menace. But now the menace has declined. Green gave the same sort of explanation - when he surrendered last week. COMMUNIST (2)

All in retaliation - for the tricks played by Canadian Students on Washington's birthday. When, in a secret, they hoisted the British Union Jack across the border in New York, And declared the United States a British Colony.
