At the United Nations - right on schedule 
the General Assembly today began its annual "China

debate"; - perennial question of whether Red China

should be admitted to the UN -- in place of the

Nationalist Chinese under Chiang Kai-Shek. A question

always answered heretofore -- with a resounding "no."

Only this year - something new has been added.

In a surprise move - the delegate from Italy urging appointment of a special U N committeel to determine wo whether the Peking regime -- wants to be represented in the world body; and if so - whether it is now ready to comply with the spirit and letter of the U N charter; and if the answer is again "yes" - to explore a possible solution to the impasse - perhaps on a "two China" basis.

Reaction from Nationalist China - a flat
rejection of the idea. The United States - also
understandably cook cool to the proposal. However, the
Italian move - apparently supported, at least in part,

by both Canada and Chile. Indicating some lively debate before the issue is finally decided -- paxe one way or the other.

## LOS ANGELES

The sports world stunned today - by the sudden retirement of Sandy Koufax -- star pitcher of the Los Angeles Dodgers. Koufax's decision to call it quits -- announced by club Vice President Buzzie Bavasi.

Three times winner of the famed Cy Young award - Koufax giving up baseball because of painful arthritis in his left arm - his pitching arm.

Latest word from Bethesda Naval Hospital:

The President - feeling "great" - by his own admission.

Continuing to make rapid recovery from his daplike double barreled surgery. To the point where doctors will permit him to fly to his Texas ranch tomorrow -- there to continue his recuperation.

The plan, thereafter, calling for several weeks of rest and relative seclusion / away from the distractions and pressures of Washington. White House Fress Secretary Bill Moyers saying the President will proce probably remain at the ranch - right through the holidays.

A sort of Republican summit meeting - just getting underway today in the Caribbean. New York's Governor Rockefeller - and Governor elect Raymond Shafer of Pennsylvania -- first to arrive. Getting things going with a combination picnic and political pow-wow - at Virgin Gorda in the British Virgin Islands. Governor Romney of Michigan, Governor Rhodes of Ohio and Senator-Elect Percy of Illinois - expected to join the confab before the wext weekend is over.

What's the meeting all about? No one's saying for the record. However, Romney gave perhaps a fairly
good hint - at a news conference prior to his departure
from Lansing. The Governor admitting he is taking "a long,
hard look" - at the question of whether he should seek the
Republican presidential nomination in SixtyEight.
Republican presidential nomination in SixtyBelow Because
said he - "those who know me best - have been urging me
to become a candidate."

Pounding rain and howling gales - continued today to plague the Po River delta in northern Italy.

The storm so fierce - that it halted the work of emergency crews trying desperately to plug shattered seawalls - on the Adriatic coast.

With little to hold it back - the sea now submerging thousands of acres of farmland; all but engulfing - the villages of Scardovari, Bonelli, Ca zuliani; Pila, Boccasetta and Porto Tolle; sending at the estimated ten thousand persons scurrying for the safety of higher ground.

More concern - in Venice; where the stormwhipped Adriatic - is eating at the party foundations of the fabled city; left virtually defenseless - by the collapse of seawalls in that discuss disastrous flood of two weeks ago.

According to Venice of ficials -another high tide like that of maximum November Fourth - and "the whole city is in danger of being destroyed."

## LANCASTER FOLLOW ITALY

US warships blasting away at a small armada of Communist vessels - carrying vital war supplies to Red forces in the South. Destroying or damaging - at kex least twenty six or of the Red ships. Carrier-based planes adding another fifteen vessels - to the day's total bag.

Back on shore - another series of Communist terror attacks. While on the fighting front -- American were forces, continuing their sweep through war zone "C" near the Cambodian border. Today capturing a succession of Communist camps, hospitals and storage depots - in previously impenetrable jungle.

## LONDON FOLLOW VIET NAM

A related item - from London. Diplomatic sources today reporting that Red China - has poured more than eighty thousand men into North Viet Nam in recent months.

The Chinese - said to be masquerading as "technical troops." Their principal job - supposedly that of supporting North Vietnamese anti-aircraft units; also that of assisting the North Vietnamese - in making repairs to roads, bridges and railways damaged by American bombs.

However, their real job - we hear - is that of strengthening Peking's political hold on Hanoi.

In Moscow - the Kremlin today denied all responsibility - for the recent arrest of Vladimir Kazan-Komarek, a naturalized American, when the Russian aeroflot plane airliner on which he was a passenger - made an unscheduled stop at Prague in his native Czechoslovakia.

According to Soviet authorities - the Moscowto Paris airliner was forced to land in Pan Prague because of malfunction in its radar equipment. The
Soviets further asserting that Prague is - "a designated
emergency landing field" - for Russia's aeroflot airline.

American officials in Moscow - later commenting that the United States has little choice but to accept the Soviet explanation. However, an Embassy spokesman adding: "If I were a former East European - flying on an American passport - I'd sure think twice about flying Aeroflot."

The powerful Jesuit Order of the Roman Catholic Church - soundly rebuked earlier this week by Pope Paul, Because certain elements in the Jesuits - had allegedly gone too far in seeking changes in the order - and also in the Mother Church.

The Pope's answer today - in a communique

following the Jesuits' thirty-first general congregation at

the Vatican. The Order pledging a "resolute reaffirmation 
of the society's unreserved commitment to service of the

Pope". Calling obedience to the Pontiff - "a hallmark

of the Jesuit code."

However, the Jesuits also announcing at the same time - a number of drastic innovations; designed to democratize the organization - and thus permit - in their own words - "far greater freedom to debate serious problems confronting the order."

The Jesuits emphasizing - beyond obedience to the Pope - "the importance of mature, responsible commitment - to the common search for wise decision."

From Cairo - a report today that Egypt is currently test-flying a new supersonic jet; featuring an engine - built by German and Austrian engineers; and said to be specially-designed -- for military use against Israel.

If all goes well - the plane scheduled for mass production beginning in Nineteen Sixty-Eight. Egyptian officials saying that the plane will be sold eventually - on the international market. Further promising that it will be - "the cheapest fighter in the world.

As for local use - Egyptian authorities emphasizing that the plane's role against Israel - would be strictly defensive as, for example - "protecting the Suez Canal" - is the way they put it.

A bit of a scare today - from America's lunar-Orbiter-Two. The spacecraft beginning its first picture-taking sequence - precisely on schedule at tentwenty-six this morning. But subsequently telemetry - indicating some sort of "irregularity" in a shutter device. Space officials fearing briefly that what they got - was nothing more than a collection of double exposures.

Fortunately, the "irregularity" turned out to be - merely a "false signal." Lunar-Orbiter-Two this afternoon transmitting back excellent photographs - of the first of thirteen potential sites for manned landing on the moon.
