Less than nine hours after returning to the White House, President Nixon was today. Discussing with key congressional leaders - the ramifications of his twelve day round the world tour.

Coming out of the conference - with a firm pledge of bi-partisan support.

Senator Majority leader Mike Mansfield for one - strongly praising the President's so-called
"declaration of Guam". His assertion that Asian nations
must provide more of their own defenses. Senator

Mansfield saying "it affords a more healthy direction for the United States and Asia."

The President also disclosed a plan afoot

- to withdraw additional numbers of American fighting

men from Vietnam. A plan to be announced -hopefully -

Senator Minority leader Everett Dirksen further

reporting that "some private inspired effort" was being an attempt to considered by the White House, This in an effort to speed a negotiated peace at Paris.

Meanwhile, the President was getting ready

for another short trip - to nearby Camp David, Maryland.

There to complete work - on a broadcast address set

for Friday night. An address, we are told - outlining

the Administration's new domestic program.

Russian reaction to President

Nixon's Romanian visit - practically non-existent raday.

The Soviet recent newspaper Pravda - confining its

coverage to seven non-committal lines. At the time,

devoting three columns - to Secretary of State William

Rogers' recent visit to Seoul, South Korea.

This - according to Kremlinologists an attempt to give the impression that the President's trip - was of relatively minor importance. Also, we are told - a demonstration of growing Soviet interest - in the Far East outlook after Vietnam.

More on the same from Hong Kong - William
Rogers' latest way stop on his Asian tour; where the
Secretary conferred today with top U.S. officials in
the British Crown Colony, coming away with the message
that Red China seems to be shifting her attention more
and more away from Viet Nam. The Chinese supposedly
turning instead - to their own problems with the Soviet
Union.

For his own part - Rogers asserting that the US - is more than "willing" to improve its relations with Mainland China. Citing as examples of America's good intentions - the recent relaxing of US trade and travel restrictions. However, the Secretary admitting that Red China seems so far inot interested."

MIDDLEEAST

In the Middle East - another series of

that Israel's position is hardening with regard to occupied

Arab territory. Information Minister quoted

as saying that country now intends to keep for all time

- both the Golan Heights and the Gaza Strip.

This next from Bonn the story of an article widely circulated appearing today in the West German magazine "Der Spiegel." Reporting that as early as Nineteen Thirty Eight - Britain's late General Sir Frank Mason MacFarlane had hatched a plan to assassinate Adolf Hitler.

British higher-ups calling the proper plan "unsportsmanlike."

General Mason MacFarlan later observing that "millions of human lives could have been saved." "But in democratic states" he added - "there is in principle an understandable, if impractical, antipathy to murder."
