For President Nixon - a surprise visit today to a Washington meeting of the families of American P O W's. The President there saying that negotiations aimed at ending the war - have been "very intensive," over the past year. Refusing, however, to give any specifics - on the grounds that it might jeopardize future progress. "I would not want to raise false hopes" - said he.

And then - an indirect swipe at George McGovern's peace plan - the President saying: "We shall under no circumstances abandon our P O W's to the good will of the enemy." And he stressed "when I use the word abandon - I speak quite deliberately in the same vein, the President saying: "It would be the most immoral thing I could think of - to give amnesty to draft dodgers and

deserters."

The President further telling the prisoner families: "I know it's been a long long vigil -I know how much you suffer - I know how much your children suffer." Adding, you've never been away from my thoughts - you've never been away from my prayers - there's nothing I want more than to bring your loved ones home."

Finally pledging: "I will never let you down."

The President's remarks - interrupted frequently by loud applause and at the end - a standing ovation.

LOS ANGELES

On the Democratic side - Senator McGovern was campaigning in Los Angeles; there attempting to assure a group of aerospace workers - that they would not lose their jobs under a McGovern Administration.

The Democratic nominee also accusing the

Republicans of hiring "at least fifty people - at substantial salaries - to sabotage and corrupt" the Democratic Party.

VIETNAM

In Vietnam - heavy fighting southwest of Hue. Farther South - government troops - retook the village of Xuan Loc; thereby reopening - vital Highway One into Saigon. In the air war - American jets blasting a Communist airfield - far to the North of Hanoi.

PENTAGON
