The latest from Washington, following the report on the State of the Nation, pictures a revolt of Democrats. Hot so much on the score of what President Truman had to say - but in the matter of what followed.

After the Truman proposals were presented
to Congress, speaker sam Rayburn announced the total

The report on the state of the Mationd
gave the President's views on that all - important subject -- taxes. He asked for what he calls a "moderate" increase. What "moderate" means will be disclosed later.

Otherwise, the President presented a general demand for the enactment of the Truman - "fair deal". Which includes such matters as the repeal of the Iaft-Hartley law, the compulsory health insurance program, the Brannan farm plan, and the racial Fights program.

The President also vent sparing into the
higher realms - commemorating the half century by summoning visions of new prosperity for the next fifty years. It was high, mid-century optimism, looking forward to a trillion dollar economy for this country. inch would mean an average income of twelve thousand dollars $a_{A}$ year per family $\left\{_{n}\right.$ the attain that, if whoop our productive power on the upgrade - aiming at a national nome of a trillion dollars a year.

However, these apocalyptic figures were over-shadowed by mathematics more immediate - when Speaker Sam Rayburn gave advance notice that, in
