Pearson's wish to retire - long an open secret in Canada. However, the suddenness of it all - still a shock; in that Pearson had been expected to stay on at least through his present term, which expires in — Le se Nineteen Seventy; in hopes of achieving a solution to the grave question of Canadian unity.

Why then-did he suddenly call it quits? The makes

Nobel Prize-winning Pearson telling reporters - that

at age seventy it seemed like a good time. "C'est

la vie," said he. "That's life."

Here at home - in Washington - yet another smashing defeat today for President Johnson's legislative program. With the House refusing to approve a compromise Foreign Aid Bill. Without further cut-backs. This despite an earlier cut of nearly one billion - in the amount the President had first requested.

However, the President faring well - across Capitol Hill, Thanks to a parliamentary blitz - by Senator Long of Louisiana - who outflanked a dozen Senate liberals - with a surprise vote early today; heading off a promised liberal filibuster - and thus assuring passage of that new Social Security Bill.

A King as of yest erday - also a hero to thousands of Greeks in exile - Constantine of Greece finds himself neither today. The Monarch stripped of his crown - by the Greek military junta he tried to topple. Forced to seclude himself in Rome & against the cries of those who say he never should have recognised the junta in the first place. While back in Athens - the ruling military clique is more powerful than ever.

What next for Constantine? Hard to say. His options including a trip to Denmark - where he has been offered a place of sanctuary; or maybe a permanent base in Rome - to form a government in exile.

What next for Greece? Only time will tell.

After a siege of bad flying weather - air war in Vietnam xxx was apparently marked today by renewed attack on the Hanoi area. This - according to reports from the Red capital; telling of a "massed air raid" - by U S jets. The North Vietnamese cliaming to have shot down - five American planes.

Meanwhile, to the south - a truce announcement in Saigon. Allied forces saying they will limit holiday cease-fires - to a total of four days; instead of thirteen as originally suggested by the Viet Cong.

Senator Percy of Illinois - also in Saigon today.

There criticizing "affluent and influential" Vietnamese

- for trying to sit out the war. Said Percy: "They are

going to lose their nation - unless they so begin to

sacrifice the way any other people sacrifice."

Those four US Navy deserters who fled to Russia back in the news today in Moscow. All four appearing
at the Finnish Embassy - armed with "foreigners"

passports from the Soviet Red Cross; applying for visas to visit Finland enroute to Sweden.

When or how they plan to make the trip - still a closely guarded secret. The why - something else again. The Soviets having made it abundantly clear - they plan to use the sailors strickly for propaganda purposes.

Red China's "cultural revolution" - so-called -a complete flop; even the Chinese themselves forced to
admit it - according to an article today in a Moscow
trade union paper.

The article citing as evidence - figures supposedly showing that Chinese industry has failed to produce even half its quota. Transportation systems - also said to have have broken down; with food costs going up - and wages down.

That Nato meeting in Brussels - finally ended today;
with publication of a closing report - marking perhaps
the beginning of a new era in East-West relations.

The document called the Harn 'l Study - after

Belgian Prime Minister Pierre Harmel who initiated it.

In effect - a blueprint of future Nato strategy. Recognizing the fact that the Defense Alliance - must maintain sufficient strength to discourage aggression. Asserting though that

Nato's rule - will become proof progressively more important in the political field; with its chief long-range goal that of second peace with the Soviets.

The report further pin-pointing German reunification as "the heart of the question of a European settlement."

Suggesting, however, that even that problem can be solved - with Nations large and small working together toward peace.

From Accra, Ghana, a story today of black magic unintended.

The magician - Professor Hindu. -, according to his
theater billing. Selecting a young man from the audience
- to take part in his greatest stunt, The Professor's
assistant, shooting the man twice in the chest - with
blanks, he said later. Whereupon the subject was placed

Half an hour later - Professor Hindu returning to the grave., planning to "resurrect" the dead man - as promised. Only trouble - he was really dead. A victim - of suffocation. Landing the Professor and his assistant - both behind bars.

The story of an almost perfect crime - comes today from Mexico City, Where one Luis Espiritu was walking along the street - when he came to a house where a loud party was in progress; complete with rock and roll band - and dozens of fruging guests.
