 At the Vatican, ~~is Rome~~ ^{we get} the final chapter ~~today~~

in the story of Hungary's "man without a country." Cardinal Josef Mindszenty - age seventy-nine - bowing ~~at last~~ to a personal appeal from Pope Paul, ^{and at long last} emerging from the U.S. Embassy in Budapest, ^{which has been his haven} ~~his place~~ of refuge for nearly fifteen years; ^{Today} flying to Rome, [^] for an emotional reunion with the Pontiff.

Cardinal Mindszenty saying: "I accept what will be perhaps - the heaviest cross of my life; I am ready to say goodbye to my favorite country - and continue a life of prayers and penitence in exile." The Pope, in turn, presenting Cardinal Mindszenty with a gold ring from the Vatican Council - as well as the cross from around his own neck.

The Vatican adding that Pope Paul recognized - what a "painful sacrifice" the Cardinal ^{is now} ~~was~~ making. But the Pontiff was moved to act - we are told - in hopes of allowing the aged Cardinal "more peaceful days."

UNITED NATIONS

Today At the United Nations, ~~here in New York~~ - a major
policy address ~~today~~ ^{by} ~~from~~ Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei
Gromyko; urging the creation of a permanent World
Disarmament Conference. - ^{This to be} outside the U.N. ^{and} to meet regularly
every two or three years ^{until} it achieves an end to the
present arms race.

Gromyko adding that Russia is ready to establish
"mutually advantageous ties" with the U.S. - on the basis of
peaceful coexistence; ~~and~~ These ties - said he - can be
political, economic, commercial, scientific, technological
and cultural in nature. But he made it plain that this ^{will be}
possible - only if there is no Washington-Peking axis aimed
at Moscow.

MOSCOW FOLLOW UNITED NATIONS

Meanwhile, ~~in Moscow~~ ^{the} Kremlin ^{was putting on a} luncheon in honor of India's Prime Minister Indira Gandhi; ~~with the piece~~ ^{at which} no friendly bouquets were directed at India's neighbor ~~at resistance~~ ^{at} ~~an attack on India's arch-rival,~~ Pakistan.

~~Soviet~~ Premier Kosygin alluding to the recent flight - of an estimated eight million East Pakistani ^s refugees ^λ fleeing into W Bengal. He said ~~charging that~~ such an occurrence - "can only be explained by unbearable living conditions" back in their homeland.

WASHINGTON

Senator Kennedy of Massachusetts - a surprise visitor today at that Washington meeting of the families of American prisoners-of-war. There charging that President Nixon's forthcoming visit to Red China - is nothing more than a "smokescreen." "While he's over there in Peking - your husbands and sons are rotting" - said Kennedy. Adding that we must negotiate with the North Vietnamese - on the basis of their own terms as presented ^{on} July One.

The Senator then went ^{on} to say - if it were up to him, he would have "crawled into the room" - if it meant getting the prisoners back. "What are we going to do" - said he - "just stand behind the flag and let them rot?" That - from Senator Kennedy.

PAPUA

Here's one - a real-life ghost story; reported today from ~~the Province of Papua~~, - ~~on the Island of New Guinea~~, with the "spirits" ^{involved} ~~in question~~ - anthropologist Wilson Wheatcroft and his wife Margaret.
