A so-called "Arab Lands Day" strike in ~~the~~ Galilee today led to a series of violent clashes ~~between~~ ^{between} Israeli ~~Arabs~~ ^{Muslims} and Israeli security forces. The latter killing ~~at~~ ^{five of the farmer,} ~~least six~~ ^{Arabs} - wounding scores more - and arresting more than three hundred. This is the worst outbreak of its kind ~~within~~ Israel - since it achieved its independence in Nineteen-Forty-Eight. The ~~Arabs~~ ^{strikes in} protesting government plans to requisition ~~traditional Arab~~ ^{certain} lands in ~~the~~ Galilee ^{for new} - ~~to~~ ^{to} permit the establishment of new Jewish settlements.

LONDON

Britain's Foreign Secretary James Callaghan today led the remaining field of three - in second-round balloting for a new British Prime Minister; in so doing, virtually assuring his election - in a run-off set for next week.

KAMPALA

Following talks with a black nationalist leader from Rhodesia - Uganda's President Amin today placed his Soviet-built air force on full alert. A spokesman saying Ugandan fighters and bombers will be ready for instant action - in the event of a Rhodesian attack on neighboring Mozambique or Tanzania.
