In Washington, a C I A psychiatrist - Doctor Bernard Malloy ^{today} testified that ~~Henry Kissinger~~ ^{today} Henry Kissinger, then a national security advisor - and White House aide John Ehrlichman had asked the C I A to produce a psychiatric ~~and~~ profile of Daniel Ellsberg who had released the Pentagon papers to the press. Malloy says he was so informed by David Young Jr., then co-director of the so-called White House plumbers unit.

Malloy was the first key defense witness in the trial of Ehrlichman and three other defendants on conspiracy charges. The defense took over shortly after the prosecution rested its case. - ~~with~~ Federal judge Gerhard Gesell ^{has advised Dr.} ~~ordering~~ Kissinger to "hold himself in readiness" as a possible defense witness.
