GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

Khrushchev - uttered some ominous words, today.

Saying - scrap the Potsdam Pact. The treaty - which made final arrangements for Europe, at the end of World War Two. Establishing - the division of Germany, which is in force, today. Khrushchev - proposing that the whole thing be abolished?

He was talking, particularly, about Berlin. The provision in the Potsdam Pact - which divided the German capital into Western and Eastern sectors. Khrushchev wanting - an end of the occupation of the city. By both Russians - and Western Allies.

What that would mean, is indicated vividly by the way he describes Berlin. Calling it - the capital of East Germany. In other words, turn West Berlin over to the East German Reds. The Western part of the city - so flourishing, while the Red sector, is shabby, bedraggled.

Khrushchev's pretext for proposing the cancellation of the Potsdam Pact - well, it's the same old story. The charge - that the Western Allies have violated the treaty. By permitting - the rearming of West Germany.

His declaration was made in Moscow, today - at a reception for Gomulka, Communist boss of Poland. And there's a supposition - that the Khrushchev demand may be followed by another attempt to force the Western powers out of West Berlin.

GENEVA

Two conferences - in Geneva, now. Neither one - going any too well.

The talks on the abolition of atomic tests - virtually deadlocked for some time. When, today, the second conference began - on how to prevent surprise atomic attacks. The Moscow delegate - promptly serving notice that there won't be any disarmament agreement, except on Russian terms.

EISENHOWER

President Eisenhower, today, proposed - that the free world establish a financial pool, to help non-communist countries - which are backward in modern development. Assist them - to modernize in a self-reliant way.

The Eisenhower proposal was made at an international meeting in Seattle, Washington. A conference - under the Colombo plan. Which was formed at the Capital of Ceylon, eight years ago, for the development - of backward countries.

IRAQ

In Baghdad, the death sentence - pronounced against one of the world's well known statesmen. Fadhil Jamali - former Premier of Iraq, and Iraqi delegate to the United Nations. Today, sentenced to hang, together with a former Chief-Of-Staff and a former Deputy Chief-Of-Staff of the army of Iraq.

In the revolt that overthrew King Feisal of Iraq, Jamali was captured. Then - put on trial for treason. One charge against him - that he helped in putting Iraq into the pro-Western Baghdad pact.

Pro-Western he was in some respects. But above all he was pro-Iraq!

Fadhil Jamali was a graduate of Columbia, a charming, and able man, with a host of friends in this country. Now a victim of the madness that has swept much of the world since World War II.

JORDAN

The story told by King Hussein of Jordan - is this:

In his private plane, he was on his way to Rome for a vacation. Flying over Syrian territory - having ~~xxx~~ previously got permission from the Syrian authorities. But, by radio - his pilot got an order to land at Damascus.

To which Hussein replied - that, if he couldn't go on, he'd fly back to his capital at Amman. But Damascus, by radio, said - no, he wouldn't be permitted to fly back.

Likely enough, the King of Jordan thought - if he ever landed in Damascus, he might be little more than a hostage of Nasser's Arab republic. So he defied the order, and his plane turned back toward Jordan.

Whereupon two Syrian jet fighters appeared, Russian-built migs - buzzing his plane, trying to force him down. But Hussein's plane was able to get back to Amman. Where the King voiced - an indignant protest.

On the Syrian side, the Nasser authorities declare - their migs were not attacking. They were merely -

escorting King Hussein's plane; all - in the business of protecting Damascus against possible surprise attack.

Which makes - quite a contradiction.

PLANE

Today, at New York's Idlewild Airport, forty passengers were waiting - to board an airliner. A big viscount turbo-prop - of the Trans-Canada Airlines. But the passengers never got aboard - lucky for them.

The airliner - waiting for them, when a giant cargo plane, about to take off, ran amuck. Possibly - because of a tire blow-out. Swerving out of control, it ran smack into the Canadian Viscount. Both Planes - immediately bursting into flames. For a tremendous fire.

No lives lost. The crew of the cargo plane - getting out safely. Aboard the airliner two hostesses - waiting to greet the passengers. The girls - jumping out in a hurry.

SCHOOL

According to everybody in Osage, West Virginia - the school dynamiting was done by somebody from the "outside." The school - integrated for five years, without trouble. Whites and negroes - living in harmony in the West Virginia mining town. So it was utterly unexpected - when the integrated school was blasted into wreckage by dynamite, early today.

The F.B.I. is on the job. The belief being - that the dynamiting was part of a widespread movement of terrorism in the south. The dynamiters - from the "outside."

NOBEL PRIZE

At a convent in Belgium, a Dominican friar was in retreat, solitary prayer, today. When he was informed - that he'd won the Nobel Peace Prize. Father Dominique Georges Pire, founder of "Europe of the Heart." An organization of charity - from the heart, in behalf - of the multitudes of pitiful refugees in this era of dislocation and conflict.

During the second world war, Father Pire was - chaplain of the Belgian underground. Later - dedicating himself to the refugees, he founded villages - where thousands of the helpless and infirm were taken to live.

So that has won for him - the Nobel Peace Prize, with forty-three thousand dollars. He says he'll devote the money - to his refugee villages. Establishing a sixth - in Norway. The village there to be named - after Anna Frank, the jewish girl whose diary became an international best seller - after she had perished in a Nazi concentration camp. Another refugee village - for "Europe of the Heart."

SACK

Here's news from the world of fashion - about the sack. which peculiar style - remains in vogue here in these United States. The sack - also spreading to Soviet Russia.

The straight-up-and-down effect may be - bourgeoisie and capitalistic. But, nevertheless, any Soviet women prefer - the voluminous dress.

Which, however, may not please American women who wear the sack. Not - after an explanation, given today by the Moscow radio. A Russian fashion announcer stating - that the style has become popular with Russian women. Those, in the words of the announcer - who, with the years, have lost their lithe figures.

In other words those husky Russian mamas. The sack - just made for them.

For several years now, this type dress has been all the vogue in Honolulu. The sack out there is a

modification of the Mother Hubbard, that was introduced long ago by the missionaries who cajoled the beautiful Polynesian women into wearing them. In Hawaii nowadays, don, they don't call this the sack, they call it the moo moo.

DOCTOR

In Chicago, a man is undergoing - his ninety-first operation. Surgery - ninety-one times! A martyr. Yes, a martyr of medicine.

Dr. Emil Grubbe, eighty-three years old - believed to be the first physician ever to experiment with X-rays as a cure for disease. Back in eighteen ninety-six, X-rays were a new discovery. Emil Grubbe - a twenty year old medical student, who became interested - in the mysterious radiation. Nobody, then, understanding - the perils of X-rays.

So, in his experiments, he became saturated with them. Causing - cancer; recurring in his body - time and again down through the years. With one operation after another - now, the ninety-first.

His only consolation - the valuable work he did, in developing X-rays for medical purposes. Rather remarkable that he has survived to the age of eighty-three.
