A treaty of military alliance was concluded today -Yugoslavia, Greece, Turkey. The ceremony of signing enacted
at a Yugoslav summer resort.

This grows out of a pact of "cooperation and friendship" signed in Turkey last year. Now, Yugoslavia, Greece and Turkey make it a military alliance. Pledging -- that they'll consider any aggression against any one of the three, as aggression against all three.

Obviously, the only possible "aggression" would be from Soviet Russia, or the Moscow satellites.

Today, on a rainy downtown street in New York -- passersby saw a man slump, and sink to the sidewalk. An ambulance was called, and the doctor said -- dead, probably from a heart attack. The victim's belongings were examined, and he was found to be -- Marcantonio. Long a stormy petrel of New York politics.

His power was in the Eighteenth Congressional District -a complex "melting pot" neighborhood. Marcantonio -repeatedly elected to Congress. Demounced -- as a Communist,

to do it.

His associates say he had suffered from diabetes. In any case, on his way to make plans for a come-back, he was stricken on the rainy street.

His downfall came when he was convicted of kidnapping

Jake The Barber, who bragged that he rose from a crap shooting

bootblack to big-shot gambler. And once played roulette with

the King of England. Jake The Barber testified in court that

the Touhy mob held him captive for eleven days -- and released

him on a seventy thousand dollar ransom.

Today, Judge Barnes ruled -- the whole thing a frame-up.

Jake The Barber -- faking the kidnap. Plotting with the Capone

Nob -- to get rid of Roger (The Terrible) Touhy; Who was

given a sentence of Ninety-Nine years. Today the Judge cancelled

that out.

In Mineteen Forty-Two, Touhy and five other desperadoes broke out of the Illinois State Prison -- but were all receptured or killed. The Terrible One -- getting a sentence of one-hundred-and-ninety-nine years for that. Which was, according to some technicality of Illinois law. Judge Barnes, today -- holding that this angle of the law was "unreasonable." So out go the one-hundred-and-ninety-nine years.

The State's attorney, Thomas Courtney, who prosecuted

Touhy -- is now a Judge. He calls today's decision - "startling".
