passed on the death sentences decreed against six Japanese war criminals - headed by Tojo, the Pearl harbor premier.

Macarthur upholds the death sentences, and orders them to be xi carried out.) His pronouncement, as cabled from Tokyo tonight, states the following: "No human decision is infallible, but $I$ can think of no judicial process where a greater safeguard was made to evolve justice. ${ }^{2}$

His declaration concluaes; "I therefore direct the Commanding General of the Eighth Army to execute the sentences as pronounced by the tribunal." The date of the executions still remains to be announced. In Tokyo there is a surmise that the date may be December Seventh the anniversary of Pearl Harbor.

The London word is that the illness of king George is grave enough to affect him for the rest of his life. Informants at Buckingham Palace declare that the malady of arteries and circulation is such that he will have to take great care and not exert himself for the remainder of his days. Even when the exceedingly painful trouble which affects his right foot has cleared up, he will never be able to go on so long and strenuous a tour as he had planned in the near future -- Australia and New Zealand.

There seems to be some element of mystery in the illness of King George. Today, the royal physicians refused to add anything to their vaguely worded announcement of last night. That the king was suffering from an obstruction of circulation in the arteries of his legs, and that a defective blood supply to his right foot, was causing anxiety.

The news has been speaking of the malady as having been caused by -- "a blood clot." But today sources close to Buckingham Palace remarked that this was not necessarily the case -- not necessarily a blood clot. London observers note that the bulletin issued by the physicians makes the specific statement that the monarch's general health is good .- "including," as the bulletin emphasizes, "the condition of his heart."

Actually, that medical report dates back to
Thursday of last week; but the illness of George the Sixth was k qt a deep secret -- because it necessitated a postponement of the scheduled royal visit to Australia
and New Zealand. It was felt that nothing should be made

public, until the governments of those dominions had been informed -- and a joint statement worked out.

The word in London today is that the King first realized that something was wrong a little more than two weeks ago -- November seventh. That was remembrance day -on which Britain pays honor to the war dead. The $K i n g$ presided at the London observance, and stood stiffly at attention -- in the rain. The London weather was bad. But it is the duty of a king to cut a royal, dignified figure, under all circumstances -- and George the sixth stood with rigid formality, while the rain came teeming down. Afterward, he felt a numbness in his right foot.

Two days later, he told Queen Elizabeth that the numbness was increasing, the foot losing all sense of feeling. He thought it was merely the result of that wet weather ordeal, and did nothing about it for some days more. But the condition did not improve, and the court physician, Sir John Weir, was called in. He examined the king's right foot, numb and without feeling, and immediately summoned specialists.

They made a thorough examination and study, and gave a full report .- that was last Thursday. They presented their medical finding to queen elizabeth. She immediately informed Princess Elizabeth -- and mother and daughter
 Princess tizabeth, herself, was then recovering from the birth of the royal baby.

The news was a sensation in London today .- with
messages of sympathy pouring in at Buckingham Palace. In Parliament Prime Minister Attlee and leader-of-the-opposition Winston Churchill paid glowing tribute to George the sixth, tho has been so earnest and unfailing in the performance of Kingly duties. During his twelve years on the throne, he has never cancelled an engagement, has never failed to make an important appearance, until now. He does so now because of illness contracted when he stood so long at attention in the rain, on Remembrance Day.

News from Palestine tells of a jail break .important because the escapers are terrorists arrested after the murder of Count Bernadotte. They fled from a prison near Haifa, fine of them recaptured .according to the news thus far.

After the U. N. mediator, cousin of the sing of Sweden, was assissinated in Jerusalem, the crime was admitted by the stern gang -- the most extremist terrorists of the Jewish underground. The Government at 'Tel Aviv, expressing its horror for the crime, made a round-up of arrests -- seizing stern lang members.

Since then we have hear little about the proceedings to bring the killers of count Bernadotte to justice. But now we are told that fourteen of the arrested sternists were imprisoned in the jail near Haifa -- and have escaped. The police of 1 stael, in announcing this, give no details of what happened -how the fugitives got away.

## CHINA

In China -- the Communists have driven to the Grand Canal. Forces of the Reds have reached that historic waterway, Southeast of Peiping)- the Grand Canal, constructed by the old time Emperors of China in centuries past, when the dragon throne represented progress and great works of engineering.

In the present day Civil War the Communists control a belt of territory that separates the Northern Chinese area of Peiping and Tientsin from Central China, the Valley of the Yangtze. Hitherto, the news has featured Red advances toward the yangtze, the shanghai-Nanking line. The battle in that area still goes on -- with new conflicting victory claims issued by both sides in the conflict for the railroad center of suchow.

The Soviet radio has scheduled one short wave broadcast a week, beamed to this country and meant for what moscow designates as "ukrainians, Poles, Czechs, Bulgarians and Serve, in the United States, " people of that ancestry. The most interesting group should be the Poles, as well as the largest Americans of Polish descent. From what $I$ know of them, their reaction to the soviet propaganda should be interesting to listen to.

The Soviet short wave broadcasts will be on the air every Thursday, seven pom. Eastern Standard time. Washington makes a special mention of this hour - so that ""illions of American Slavs" wont miss the messages from Moscow.

From washington - a hint that resident Truman will ask for price control and rationing. This emanates from Chester Bowles, one time price fixer and rationing boss of the $u$ PA - who was elected Governor of Connecticut in the recent election. Chester Bowles had a chat with resident Truman today - and upon emerging he intimated that the President will take vigorous action to combat inflation. One angle would be the price controlrationing program which the President vainly asked the Eightieth Congress to enact.

News from "ashin goon tells of the indictment of former Congressman slaughter of Missouri -- that same Congressman who figured in a lot of controversy involving President Truman. When he served, Congress, he was a bitter opponent of Truman policies, and the President intervened to bring about his defeat in the Missouri primaries of Nineteen Forty six. (The "hate House gave support to an opposing candidate who ran in the primary -- and thereupon lost the election. All of which brought about noisy charge and counter-charge -- the white House purging the Congressman.)

His indictment, announced in washington today, alleges violation of the lobbying law. A Federal Grand Jury hands down the charge that Congressman Slaughter tried to influence legislation in behalf of western grain interests and was paid large sums for this .- without registering as a lobbyist, as required by law. So now, -- indicted. Late news brings a reply from the accused former Congressman, who says "The charges are false, fraudulent and politically inspired."

Former resident Hoover states tonight
that his federal Reform Commission will recomaena ways to save two hundred and fifty million dollars a year by cutting red tape in the government system of purchasing. This will be a major point in the program the Hoover commission is about to submit for federal reorganization. The former resident says that federal purchases are bogged down in miles and miles of red tape which need to be cut for a saving to a quarter of $\boldsymbol{a}^{\boldsymbol{a}}$ billion dollars a year. He said that government agencies pass out some three million purchase orders a year, and half of these are for ten dollars or less. The paper work for a single item xxx costs more than ten collars. It may take ten dollars worth of bookkeeping to buy a dollar worth of pencils!

Here's doing a job for the president - passing along a reply that he feels he himself should write. But he cant do it -- there are too many replies. President Truman has received a deluge of congratulations on his election victory - more that fifty thousand letters and ten thousand telegrams. It is a bipartisan assortment, with Republicans applauding that Truman knockdown political fight and surprise victory. The President would like to answer each one, but explains: "Lt would be impossible to send individual acknowledgments without slowing down the necessary day by day work of the White House." So he asked press and radio to convey his reply.

RAINMAKERS. . .
The air force gives a report on its rain-
making experiments - that much talked of idea of creating artificial rain. So whats the optimistic verdict? Well, the air force experts declare doggedly that they have not given up hope. For two years they've been sending airplanes to scatter dry ice on rainclouds - the theory being, the dry ice will "seed" the rain clouds, and precipitate a downpour. But all they know is this:- The experiments have not shown conclusively - that it cannot be done. So they're going to keep right on - trying out that rain magic with dry ice.

Actually, that weather witchcraft has not produce anything more than a gentle dew-not that they can be certain about. In some cases, when a plane "seeded" clouds, it did start raining. But the scientists explain that a shower was in the making, and it probably would have rained anyway.
