In the flood news, a dispatch from Pennsylvania
states: "The threat of death flows down a one hundred mile length of the Schuylkill river." A threat of - explosive death. Sounds odd - a deluge with explosions. But here's the fantastic thing that happened:-

So all along the Schuylkill, down to Philadelphia,
the people have been alerted by the police: ' Look out - for those floating blasting caps! In Philadelphia, fifty thousand

placards posted along the river - giving the wrnoxr warning. The Schuyikill, in violent flood. And the Delaware
is on the rampage - the river expected to rise above the record - breaking flood in Wineteen Three. On two islands In the Delaware, six hundred and fifty boy scouts, marooned evacuated by miti helicopters.

Havoc in the Pocono section of mountain resorts.
Stroudsburg - reporting thirteen lives lost, apparently out of
a pass probable Pennsylvania total of twenty nine fatalities.
The Lehigh River, which flows past Allentown,
has reached the highest flood level in its history. Twenty-
three feet - which is more than seventeen feet above normal.
At Easton, the city water supply cut off.
At Bethlehem, the steel plants flooded to a depth
of twenty-five feet.
At Scranton - a state of emergency, tonight. Many homes were swept away. Water supply - cut off.

Same story in New York - the lower valley of the Hudson. At Port Jervis, one hundred people marooned by the deluge rescued by army helicopters, today. Among them thirty-six boy scouts, trapped by the flood while on an outing.

Helicopters - dropping food and medical supplies
to stranded motorists and campers. Firemen u ing
ladders - to reach people marooned in up er stories of
their homes. Five hundred families ordered evacuated in Kingston. In Columbia County forty-eight children evacuated from a summer camp. Near Peekskill-Army "ducks" navigating on the flood, taking people out. At Wassaic, New York Central railroad bridge
washed out. On the Harlem Division of the railroad, service cut off north Brewster and Pawing in my own locelity where many bridges are out and ten or eleven inches of rain fell.

The menace to life all the greater - because
of vacationers and camper. The floods hitting - favour te resort areas. In the Catskill o, for example, the xttexxi Ellenville resort section - is nine feet under water.

Philadelphia - a thousand people evacuated from
low lying areas in the city. Major industries - shut down.

Massacusetts - Governor Herter has declared a state
of emergency - in Central and western parts of the state.
Thousands of people - evacuated from towns west of Worcester.
Connecticut: Governor Ribicoff places the damage
in the northwestern part of the state alone - at one billion
dollars.

Other states, Rhode Island, New Jersey, Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, District of Columbia - also hit hard by the floods. The story far and wide is one of towns washed out, buildings, flooded, highways cut off, bridges down, communications out. All - the result of hurricane Diane. Which blew itself out, sweeping inland - with wa torrents of rain.

The tropical storm - dumping a veritable ocean of
water, from its murky clouds.

Last night, the American coal ship, Argo-Beam, was
navigating on the stormy North Atlantic, due south of Iceland,
when fire broke out in the engine room. The ship - in danger of swift, flaming disaster. Captain George Watson gave the order: -"flood the engine room! "Which was done - and the fire was brought under control. But the coal ship was left without power - drifting helpless in a heavy southwestern gale.
Sixty-five miles away, was the Swedish liner

Kungsholm. Bound for New York, with sever-hundred-and-eighty passengers. The Kungsholm picked up distress signals - and steamed, immediately, to the rescue.

Result - a great sea spectacle for the passengers
aboard the Kungsholm. Swedish sailors taking two lifeboats across to the derelict American vessel. Making their way through heavy seas, waves like mountains.

Aboard the stricken coal ship, nine sailors, one leaped into
after another - the boiling sea. Picked up - by the lifeboats,

A magnificent job of seamanship - all hands rescued.
The captain of the Argo-Beam and his first mate -
remaining aboard, to save the ship and cargo of coal, from being claimed for salvage.

Tonight, a U.S. weather ship is on the scene - ${ }^{-}$
and the Kungsholm is on its way to New York with survivors.

Moscow has accepted the terms put forth by West German Chancellor Adenauer - as a condition for his visit to the Soviet capital. The chancellor requested that the talks should include - German reunification. Also - return of German prisoners of war still held in Russia.

Today, Moscow sent a note saying - okay. So Adenauer goes to Moscow.

In Korea, today, the Communists agreed on a meeting set for Sunday. Responding to an American demand - for two U.S. air force flyers, whose trainer plane was shot down by the Reds, over a demilitarized area.

The Communists, themselves, have said nothing about the incident. It isn't even known if the two American flyers are alive, surviving the crash.

Today, the Reds responded - with no information at
all. But - okayed the meeting.

At East Landing, Michigan, the Association of
American Agricultural editors, today - sent messages to
President Eisenhower and Soviet Premier Bulganin. Messages

at the Michigan State University Centennial of Farm
Mechanization. Saying - housewives would promote a hk better understanding of family life.

So now this appeal to President Eisenhower and Premier Bulganin.) Let Russian housewives have a look at the mechanization of the American home. It should open their eyes.
