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**J**ULIAN WHEELER CURTISS, Yale '79, began his association with intercollegiate rowing as a member of the crew of his alma mater in 1878, the first year of Harvard-Yale rowing on the Thames. Referee of the Poughkeepsie Regatta since 1918, dean of rowing officials in the United States, his skill in handling the large number of Poughkeepsie entries is each year a cause for admiration from rowing enthusiasts.

The Referee's yacht this year is E. Townsend Irvin's "Tara."





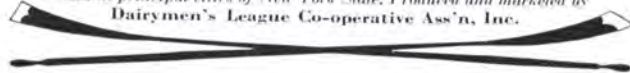
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# THE COACHES



GLENDON, OF COLUMBIA

Hubert Glendon started his coaching career in 1928 as coach of Columbia's 150-pound crew. His lightweight crew that year won the Joe Wright Cup and the following year went to England to win the Marlowe at Henley. In 1932, he turned out another championship eight to win the Joe Wright Cup. He became head coach in 1934 with his famous father, Richard A. (Old Dick) Glendon as associate, the elder Glendon retiring after the 1936 season. Alastair MacBain, Columbia '29, former Columbia varsity stroke and twice a member of Poughkeepsie championship 'varsity crews, is Glendon's chief aide.

SANFORD, OF CORNELL

Harrison Sanford, six-foot five-inch former Washington oarsman, is in his third season as head coach of the Cornell crews. His association with Cornell rowing began in 1923, when the Ithacans were the only crew to beat the Husky freshmen, with Sanford at No. 7. An outstanding pupil of Rusty Callow, now coach at Pennsylvania, he later rowed in winning Washington crews with Al Ulbrickson and Tom Bolles. Sanford was in business in Seattle from his graduation in 1926 until he went to Cornell. Norman Sonju, freshman coach, is another pupil of Rusty Callow and a 1927 Washington graduate.



TEN EYCK, OF SYRACUSE

Now in his second season as head crew coach at Syracuse, "Ned" Ten Eyck succeeded his father, the late James A. Ten Eyck, Orange mentor for 34 years. He had previously coached several boat clubs and was head coach at Rutgers for four years before coming to assist his father in 1937. A champion sculler, "Ned" competed from 1895 to 1901 without losing a race. He was the first American to win the Diamond Sculls at the Royal Henley, accomplishing the feat when only 17, and was national singles sculling champion in 1898, '99, '00 and '01, in addition to holding the doubles title with Charles Lewis.

WALSH,  
OF NAVY

Charles S. Walsh is serving his eighth year as head coach of rowing at the Naval Academy. A former Navy oarsman and a graduate of the Academy in 1923, he returned to Annapolis as assistant crew coach in 1924. In 1926 he was named coach of the freshman crew, and was appointed head crew coach in 1932.



EBRIGHT,  
OF CALIFORNIA

Carroll M. "Ky" Ebright, California crew coach since 1924, has won more Poughkeepsie 'varsity races than all the other coaches with crews on the Hudson this year put together. In addition, Ebright had the best crews in the world in 1928 and 1932 — Olympic Games title holders. This year, his 'varsity crew established the best time ever made in 36 years of Pacific Coast rowing history when they defeated Washington by 6 lengths with a time of 14:48.4.

HUNN, OF WISCONSIN

Ralph E. Hunn is, at 28 years, one of the youngest rowing coaches in any major American university. A Badger coxswain in '31 and '32, Hunn then served as freshman crew coach at Wisconsin under George W. Murphy. When Murphy resigned in 1933, Hunn succeeded him as 'varsity coach. Under Hunn, rowing interest has been greatly increased in the student body.



ULBRICKSON, OF WASHINGTON

Thirteen years ago oarsman-captain Al Ulbrickson stroked his second Washington 'varsity to victory here at Poughkeepsie. The next year he became head crew coach for the Huskies, and is one of the two youngest crew coaches in the nation and the only coach in the history of the Regatta who has twice watched all three of his boats sweep the Hudson. Of the 25 races that Ulbrickson-coached boats have rowed on the Hudson, Washington has won 11. In his 36 races in the Pacific Coast Regatta, Washington shells have lost but eight events.





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## HOW TO IDENTIFY THE CREWS

The competing crews may be identified by the color of the coxswain's jersey and of the flag on the bow of the shell, as follows:

Columbia—light blue	California—gold
Cornell—light red and white	Washington—white
Syracuse—orange	Wisconsin—red
Navy—dark blue	

## ORDER OF FINISH

### *Announced by Salvo of Bombs*

In each race, the *first* crew to pass under the Railroad Bridge will be announced by a salvo of bombs, the number of bombs fired corresponding to the number of the *lane* of the leading crew. The *first* crew to cross the finish line in each race will be announced in the same manner.

### *Indicated by Flags*

The order in which the crews *finish* will also be indicated by flags suspended from both the Railroad and the Vehicular Bridge, the regular college colors of the winning crew being the top flag. Flags will also be hoisted on the mast of the referee's boat, the colors of the winning crew being the uppermost flag—the rest hoisted in the order of finish. The flags will be of the following colors:

Columbia—light blue and white	California—dark blue and gold with white "C"
Cornell—red and white	Washington—purple and gold with white "W"
Syracuse—orange with dark "S"	Wisconsin—red with white "W"
Navy—blue and gold with white "N"	

### *By Bulletin Board*

A Bulletin Board has been erected on the Judges' Boat, located at the Finish Line. The order in which the *first three* crews finish in all races will be indicated on this Board, the lane number of the crew being used in place of its college name. This use of the lane number was found necessary owing to the distance of the Judges' Boat from the shore.

The lane number of the winning crew will be at the top, and below it will be the lane numbers of the other two crews, in the order of finish.

The time made by each crew will appear opposite the number of its lane. For example, if the crew in lane No. 10 won, and its time was 20 minutes and 30 1-5 seconds, the top line on the board would read: "10-20-30-1."
