CONGRESS: At that continuing Soviet Party Congress in Moscow-Russia still maintaining an official "soft line" toward
Red China. But not so -- two of her satellites.

Top Communists from Hungary and Czechoslovakia -today denouncing the Chinese as "splitters--psuedo-leftist
adventurers -- anti-Soviets and revisionists." Adding that
"there has never been anti-Soviet communism--nor will there
ever be."

All this in sharp contrast -- to an earlier speech
by Soviet Communist Party boss Breaks Brezhnev, orging a
Sino-Soviet summit meeting -- to settle their ideological
differences.

After more than a year of peace -- renewed fighting today between Ethiopia and Somalia. Reports from Addis

Ababa -- telling of a fierce border clash at Eneguha. With at least one Ethiopean killed -- a number wounded and the battle still on.

A staggering legal precedent -- set today in the U.S. Court of Appeals at Washington. In the case of a District of Columbia man -- convicted of being drunk in public.

The court reversing his conviction -- suspending a ninety-day sentence -- ordering him immediately freed; on the gronds that he had been arrested seventy times for intoxication -- over the last thirty years; and was thus a chronic alcholic -- a sick man -- not a man who should go to jail.

With the mercury headed toward ninety - an attack of heavy smog today in downtown Los Angeles. Prompting local officials to call -- a first stage amog alert. The first time ever necessary to call an elert -- so early in the year. Smog in Los Angeles usually heaviest in the fall.

PACIFISTS

A band of pacifists -- put to the test today in Boston.

And they came through with flying colors -- black and blue.

The pacifists -- eleven in all -- assembled on the steps of South Boston District Court, awaiting arraighment on charges resulting from a recent peace demonstration -- outside the Boston Army Base, when four of them decided to burn their draft cards -- apparently for the benefit of a group of passing high school students.

Quick as a wink -- some twenty-five to thirty students

pounced on the pacifists. Girls shouting "yellow" and "woward"

punching and kicking the pacifists -- Warren -- until they

were rescued by court attendants and FBI men.

The National Academy of Sciences, at a Washington meetingtoday devoted itself to the problems of environmental polluiton.

The Academy declaring that society must learn to
manage its wastes -- by reconverting all waste to useful
purposes; because man can no longer -- simply throw away
refuse. The Academy noting that "as the earth becomes more
crowded -- one man's trash basket may well be another man's
living space."

So now Warren let's make room for Phil Risuto -or someone. And S.1.u.tom.
