## President Nixon declares himself "in" via his letter

to former New Hampshire Governor Lane Dwinell - his
chief supporter in the Granite State.

In it saying: "It was in New Hampshire I began my
campaign for the Presidency four years ago." Adding: "I
have tried to be true to the trust expressed in me then -
to bring peace and progress both abroad and at home - to
give America the leadership it needs for a new era of national
greatness." And, "we have made in these past three years"
he continued - "significant progress."

The President going on: "I want to complete the
work that we have begun - and, therefore, I shall be a candidate for renomination and reselection.

He makes it plain that he will not campaign
personally in New Hampshire or anywhere else - until after
the National Convention. Said former Governor Dwinell:

I think the people will respect the decision, realizing "there

cannot be as much absenteeism in the Presidency - as in the Congress."

In the fighting in southeast Asia - an enemy
drive today, apparently aimed at cutting off the southern tip
of Laos. At the same time, in South Vietnam, President

Thieu was warning his field commanders against the possibility
of another enemy Tet Offensive. This was followed by a
strike - into North Eastern Cambodia; with some two
thousand Saigon troops attempting to head off an enemy
build-up.

India in an upgrading of its diplomatic mission to Hanoi to full Embassylevel, says this will not affect relations with Saigon.

The US State Department reacted by charging

India with abandonment of its supposedly neutral position.

Also suggesting India step down as Chairman of the

International Control Commission; which policing the socalled demilitarized zone - between North and South Vietnam.

Meanwhile, the Pentagon disclosing,

move At to strengthen $U$ S influence in the Indian ocean: The eight ship $U$ Task force there
sent
cruise there indefinitely.

> A Pentagon spokesman explaining that "this
particular deployment" - was originally related -
"obviously, to the international situation on the
sub-continent." Adding, however, that future $U S$
naval operations in the Indian Ocean - will be
considered strictly "routine."

CUT bACK follow pentagon

The Pentagon also announces another planned cut back in the overall size of the $U$ S armed forces;
from a present two-point-six million men - down to two-point-four million, hopefully, by next summer. The smallest figure - since the start of the Korean war.

At the Western White House -the wind up of the two days of talks between President Nixon and Japan's visiting Premier Salto. The latter saying his parley with the President - had "contributed to strengthening the unshakeable relationship of mutual trust between the U.S.
and Japan. He also expressed hope that the President's visit to Peking and Moscow - will bring about fruitful
achievements for peace and prosperity of the world."

Then - a joint communique. The President and the Premier announcing plans for a new "hot line" between Washington and Tokyo. Also, indicating that all nuclear weapons - will be removed eventually from Okinawa. Okinawa to revert to Japan as of May lith.
