President Ford, still at Vail, Colorado, on his Christmas holiday; this morning he exchanged presents with his family and then took off for another day on skis his fourth at Vail, in the Western slope. With the mercury at twelve below - the President went up the eleven thousand foot mountain - accompanied by ski instructor Dennis Hoeger - plus, of course, the usual secret service contingent (I wonder how they handle the Vail trails?) and several friends, perhaps Pete Seibert and Pepi Gramshammer. For the skiing President it was another ideal day in the Colorado Rockies.

A meeting with top economic advisors, has been scheduled by the President for Saturday; at Vail.

Secretary Kissinger sent President Ford a fifty

page report today dealing with the CIA's alleged domestic

spying activities - the latest to come up on Capitol Hill. An

Air Force plane flew the report to Colorado.

The document prepared by CIA director William Colby - is in answer to newspaper reports that the CIA, at one time, had the names of ten thousand Americans in its files.

CIA spokesmen say only those Americans in illegal contact with foreign governments were put under surveillance.

Meanwhile in Washington there was a tense situation on the White House grounds, for about four hours this morning. A young black man - wearing an Arab head-dress - crashed his car through a gate and then warned police his body was wired with explosives from head to toe. After demanding to talk to the Pakistani Ambassador, the man - was identified as cab driver Marshall Fields, about twenty, a native, of Silver Springs, Maryland - finally surrended without making his motives clear. No shots were fired, and Fields was taken to a hospital for psychiatrist observation. The "explosives" turned out to be mere auto warning flares. The young man, not an Arab, obviously deranged.

An Air India Seven Forty Seven Jumbo Jet with one hundred fifty five aboard - landed safely at the Rome airport today. The story? The plane - flying from Bombay to New York - was over Athens when a male passenger burst into the cockpit - flourishing a pocket knife and ordering the pilot to "crash" the plane into Rome. Two stewards overpowered the would-be hi-jacker who turned out to be a Czech-born Canadian. When questioned his replies were incoherent. So, it was more madness. However, the Rome police say he had in his pockets two thousand dollars in counterfeit Canadian bills.
