You sometimes hear it said - we all have - that one of the important things that can happen to a Republican candidate - is to have the name of "Eisenhower" on his side. Some kind of magic in it. The Pennsylvania governor announcing that his name will be placed before the San Francisco Convention - by Doctor Milton Eisenhower, and that this will have the blessing of Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Meanwhile, Scranton is still trying to round up delegate strength, again in Illinois - where last week Goldwater took a clear forty-eight out of fifty-eight.

GOLDWATER

While Governor Scranton is trying to lure delegates away from Goldwater the latter is trying to capture the uncommitted. Specifically - the uncommitted from Wisconsin and Ohio. The Senator's backers, meeting with the Badger and Buckeyes delegations, urging all of them to get aboard the bandwagon, increase that momentum toward that first-ballot nomination.

PLATFORM

Meanwhile the battle inside the Platform Committee-is a battle royal shaping up? Scranton is calling for a plank - declaring the Civil Rights Law constitutional. The Pennsylvania Governor trying to put Goldwater - on the spot, because Goldwater has termed the law - unconstitutional.

The Goldwater reply is a demand that the Supreme Court be allowed to decide on that. The Arizonan, however, will agree to a plank - calling on the next President to enforce the Civil Rights Law. Which Goldwater says he will do - if elected. Do it despite any personal preferences - he may have.

Republican Platform Chairman Laird of Wisconsin insists he is taking a neutral line. That his platform committee - won't have any individual candidate in mind during its deliberations.

CIVIL RIGHTS

The pattern in the South in regard to the Civil Rights Law - seems to be this. General compliance - but some refusals. And - some arrests.

According to a U.P.I., hotels and restaurants have integrated - in more than fifty cities below the Mason-Dixon Line. Serving Negroes because it is now unlawful - to refuse. The transition, achieved peacefully - in the few days since President Johnson signed the measure.

But trouble continues to break out - despite the law. Fifty integrationists, arrested - in Selma, Alabama. The Robert E. Lee Hotel in Jackson, Mississippi - has closed its doors. And state employees walked out of the Capital cafeteria in Baton Rouge, Louisiana - when a group of integrationists walked in.
