Labor Day took on a special meaning in the White House Rose Garden. It was Pension Day - with President Ford signing a new law guaranteeing minimum retirement benefits for workers who are covered by private pension plans. Many of the country's top government, labor and business leaders were present for the signing ceremony.

Said the President: "This is a model of what can be done to improve the lives of Americans without harming our free enterprise system."

It does not require employers to have pension plans; but under certain conditions, like being on the job at least five years, it guarantees benefits for those whose employers do have pension plans.

President Ford flew by helicopter for the ceremony, then back to Camp David to spend the remainder of the holiday weekend with his family.
