SENATE

FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE THE McCARTHY ERA - THE U. S. SENATE WAS ASKED TODAY TO CENSOR ONE OF ITS OWN. THE SENATE ETHICS COMMITTEE UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDING A VOTE OF CENSOR - AGAINST SENATOR DODD OF CONNECTICUT,<sup>9</sup> FOR TURNING SUPPOSED CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS - TO HIS OWN PERSONAL USE.

THE COMMITTEE'S RECOMMENDATION - READ BY CHAIRMAN JOHN STENNIS OF MISSISSIPPI<sup>A</sup> CHARGING, IN PART, THAT DODD'S CONDUCT "IS CONTRARY TO ACCEPTED MORALS - DEROGATES FROM THE PUBLIC TRUST EXPECTED OF A SENATOR - AND TENDS TO BRING THE SENATE INTO DISHONOR AND DISREPUTE."

THE FULL SENATE - EXPECTED TO BEGIN DEBATE ON THE RECOMMENDATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE - PERHAPS AS EARLY AS NEXT WEEK. IN THE MEANTIME, THE COMMITTEE REFERRING CERTAIN PHASES OF ITS PROBE - TO THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT AND THE INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE. THIS TO PERMIT FURTHER STUDY - OF "POSSIBLE LAW VIOLATIONS" - SAID THE REPORT.

VIET NAM

MOUNTING AIR WAR IN VIET NAM - MARKED TODAY BY NEWS OF THE LOSS OF  
FOUR MORE AMERICAN JETS OVER HANOI AND HAIPHONG. HEAVIEST SINGLE DAY TOLL  
THIS YEAR, <sup>X</sup> IN AERO X COMBAT IN OVER NORTH VIET NAM - ~~WEEKEND~~ THIRTEEN -  
THE NUMBER OF AMERICAN PLANES ALREADY LOST TO ENEMY FIRE THIS WEEK.

BE THAT AS IT MAY - THE AIR WAR IS TAKING AN INCREASING TOLL OF NORTH  
VIETNAMESE WAR MAKING FACILITIES. RECONNAISSANCE TODAY DISCLOSING TOTAL  
DESTRUCTION OF A KEY BRIDGE NEAR HANOI - ON THE COUNTRY'S ONLY RAIL AND ROAD  
SUPPLY LINE FROM RED CHINA. ALONG WITH DESTRUCTION OF FOURTEEN WAREHOUSES -  
IN A POWER CENTER NORTH OF THE RED CAPITAL.

BASED ON THE GROUND - HEAVY FIGHTING IS REPORTED AGAIN TODAY - ON THE  
~~PRICES OF THAT~~ <sup>socalled</sup> ~~SUPERIOR~~ DEMILITARIZED ZONE, INCLUDING A MORTAR ATTACK ON U. S.  
MARINES - TRYING TO BUILD A "LITTLE MAGINOT LINE" JUST BELOW THE D.M.Z.

WASHINGTON FOLLOW NEWS VIET NAM

HERE AT HOME - INCREASING SPECULATION TODAY ABOUT THE WAR IN VIET NAM,  
CENTERED ON THE QUESTION - OF HOW MANY MORE U. S. TROOPS MAY BE NEEDED IN THE  
BATTLE ZONE.

THE ISSUE ALL THE MORE TIMELY - IN VIEW OF GENERAL WESTMORELAND'S  
PRESENCE IN WASHINGTON, WITH THE U. S. COMMANDER IN VIET NAM - SCHEDULED FOR  
DOUBLE DUTY TOMORROW, FIRST - TO ADDRESS A JOINT SESSION OF CONGRESS; AND  
LATER - TO CONTINUE PRIVATE CONSULTATIONS WITH THE PRESIDENT.

SOURCES CLOSE TO THE MILITARY - SAYING WESTMORELAND MAY ASK FOR AS  
MANY AS A HUNDRED THOUSAND ADDITIONAL FIGHTING MEN. BUT WHETHER HE WILL GET  
~~THEY~~ <sup>HE</sup> SAID TO HENNESSY DEPEND ON HOW FAR AND HOW FAST - THE PRESIDENT IS WILLING  
TO PRESS THE WAR.

CAMP SPRINGS

TURNING TO DOMESTIC AFFAIRS - PRESIDENT JOHNSON TOOK A BITTER SWIPE  
TODAY - AT CRITICS OF HIS EDUCATION PROGRAM NOW PENDING IN CONGRESS. THIS  
IN A SPEECH DEDICATING A NEW VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER - AT CAMP SPRINGS,  
MARYLAND.

CHIEF OPPONENTS OF THE PROGRAM - GUILTY OF PLAYING POLITICS WITH THE  
ISSUES - SAID THE PRESIDENT. ADDING: "THEY ARE RAISING THE SAME ROAD BLOCKS -  
WHICH HALTED FEDERAL AID TO EDUCATION FOR TWENTY LONG YEARS;" THEY ARE TRYING  
TO REVIVE BITTERNESS BETWEEN CHURCH AND PUBLIC SCHOOL LEADERS - BETWEEN POOR  
AND WEALTHY STATES.

THE PRESIDENT CONCLUDING: "WE MUST NOT LOSE ALL WE HAVE GAINED  
BY THIS RECKLESS EFFORT FOR PARTISAN POLITICAL ADVANTAGE."

UTRECHT

THIS NEXT - A LONG TIME COMING - BUT NO LESS WELCOME. AT Utrecht  
IN THE NETHERLANDS - CROWN PRINCESS BEATRIX OF HOLLAND - GIVING BIRTH TODAY  
TO A SON; FIRST MALE CHILD BORN TO THE HOUSE OF ORANGE - SINCE 1851 A HUNDRED  
AND SIXTEEN YEARS AGO.

BOTH MOTHER AND CHILD - REPORTED IN "SATISFACTORY" CONDITION.  
WITH DUTCH CITIZENS AND GERMANS ALIKE - JOINING IN A GREAT CELEBRATION OF THE  
EVENT. THE FATHER - YOU RECALL - GERMAN-BORN PRINCE CLAUS; WHO'S MENTIONED TO  
BEATRIX - CAUSED SO MUCH ~~CONCERN~~ LAST YEAR.

PARIS

In Paris -- DeGaulle today announced plans to visit  
late Canada in July. The news immediately raising speculation  
-- that he may also visit the United States at the same  
time.

However, DeGaulle aids saying only -- that details of  
the trip were still in the planning stage, and based so  
far solely on DeGaulle's determination -- to make the  
visit, quote, "a memorable reaffirmation of French-Canadian  
friendship."

ADD PARIS

Of course he'll visit -- Expo Sixty-Seven; which opened officially today -- in Montreal.

Canadian Prime Minister Lester Pearson personally lighting the flame -- that will burn throughout the six months' fair. Then taking dignitaries from some sixty nations -- on a grand tour of the lavish exhibition.

Expo Sixty-Seven -- surely a sight to behold.

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And there's an International Exposition in session this week, here in Nevada -- the Intern-Expos of Flight -- and a general conference, to discuss American and world aviation problems -- airlines, military, manufacturers -- and private flyers and their special problems. Arthur Godfrey and a few more of us are taking part in this at the Los Vegas convention hall tonight. The exposition is organized by Capts. Fred Austin and Harrison Finch, the two who, a year and a half ago, organized the great flight around the world over both poles.

RED CHINA

LATEST from Peking -- an indication today of continuing turmoil -- in Red China's vast Liberation Army. This apparent from an editorial -- in the official Army newspaper; demanding a new, stepped-up drive against those remaining officers who still oppose Chairman Mao.

Meanwhile, China watchers were remarking today -- on the amazing staying power of President Liu Shao-Chi. For all the attacks on him by Mao supporters -- he is reported still in Peking -- still free -- still President; and apparently still has considerable strength -- throughout Red China.

## MATO GROSSO

Doctor Ian Bishop -- a Zoologist from England's Leicester University -- has arrived in Brazil for final preparations pertaining to an expedition that will include other British scientists next month, deep in the Mato Grosso a region twice the size of Texas -- still largely unexplored. A hostile area where death may lurk behind any tree -- Indians with poisoned arrows; or wild animals; to say nothing of the rivers infested with flesh-eating Piranha; the region where Colonel Fawcett vanished in nineteen-twenty-five while searching for the remains -- of what he believed was once a great civilization.

This time the adventurers will try to map a new route, a great highway Brazil hopes to build one day across the Mato Grosso; to open it up to what we call the Progress of Civilization. Will they find any trace of that long ago Fawcett expedition? Who knows.

Fawcett who would be a hundred years old now, took

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with him two young men -- his son, Jack Fawcett, and Ralei  
Rommel; both of whom could still be alive -- in their  
early sixties.

"Jack Fawcett -- I presume." What a thrill -- that  
would be!

TELLER

Here's something of a switch: A prediction today that peace time use of Hydrogen bombs -- could turn out to be an effective weapon against city smog. The authority for this -- no less than Doctor Edward Teller -- socalled "Father of the H Bomb".

Doctor Teller in Washington -- for a spring meeting of the American Physical Society; telling fellow delegates that underground Nuclear explosions -- could release trillions of tons of Sulphur-free natural gas; and reduce smog -- said Doctor Teller -- since it contributes far less to air polution than other fuels.

Turning to outer space -- Doctor Teller adding that nuclear explosives could also prove to be the best way -- to discover the inner resources of the moon.

CHICAGO

The prying eye of television -- capable of going almost anywhere these days. And that includes the inside of the human body -- according to word today from Chicago.

Doctor Irving Bush of Cook County Hospital -- explaining the technique. Beginning with a tubular instrument -- called a cystoscope; equipped with a series of camera lenses -- and then inserted into the body to relay what it "sees" -- to a closed circuit television screen, to enable doctors to observe a patient's internal organs at work -- and then prescribe treatment if necessary. With the patient also actually able to see what ails him.

Best of all -- says Doctor Bush -- all this to be video-taped for summer re-runs in training schools; or even for "home movies?"

DERBY

In the four years since the tragic death of President Kennedy -- his name has been memorialized in countless ways. In roads, buildings, institutions -- even whole communities. And now -- the strangest memorial of all.

With Kennedy family permission -- a British Brewery today disclosing the news. A plan to name a new pub -- on the outskirts of Derby, England -- the "John F. Kennedy Pub."

Site of the establishment -- in an area known as "American Estate : Where most of the roads have been named after American Presidents and American places. Now the John F. Kennedy Pub with a public bar -- called the "Boston Room;" and a lounge -- called the "Pentagon." And from KLAV -- so long until tomorrow.
