GOOD EVENING EVERYBODY:

A sweeping seven point plan from President Johnson -- was presented today at resumption of the Geneva disarmament conference; a plan -- said the President -- to end the nuclear arms race -- "while there is still time."

By continuation of the current limited test ban treaty agreement with a new non-proliferation treaty -- plus a verified halt in the production of nuclear arms -- and a reduction of present nuclear stockpiles.

Pope Paul also appealed directly to the confernce for the first time -- urging "positive and concrete results" for the sake of peace. And a similar appeal -- from U.S. Secretary U7 Thant.

ADD ARMS

But from Russia, the same old line. Delegate
Tsarapkin -- in his first official statement, saying that
aggression in Viet Nam -- "leads to the threat" that
disarmament talks will again be "fruitless."

VIETNAM

The deadly game of cat and mouse -- today in Vietnam, with both sides paying heavily.

A force of Viet Cong sneaking up on American troops -- caught from behind by South Korea's famed "Tiger Division." Although outnumbered two to one -- the Koreans decimated the Guerillas; accounting for at least thirty-five dead.

Later, a case of turnabout -- near that big American airfield at Chu Lai.

ADD VIET NAM

A small patrol of U.S. Marines out to set up an ambush, ran head on into a large force of Communists. The Marines badly mauled -- reportedly suffering "heavy casualties."

INDIA

AT NEW DELHI--NEWLY ELECTED MRS. INDIRA GHANDI TODAY PERFORMED HER FIRST OFFICIAL ACT--AS PRIME MINISTER OF INDIA. THE FIRST LADY OF HINDUSTAN CANCELLING A RECENT CUT IN THE RICE RATION--IN THE COMMUNIST DOMINATED STATE OF KERALA. RESTORING THE RICE QUOTA-- TO FIVE OUNCES A DAY FOR AN ADULT.

AT THE SAME TIME--MRS. GHANDI PROMISED A FULL REVIEW OF THE SITUATION NEXT MONTH, TO SEE IF THE RATION CAN BE FURTHER INCREASED--FROM IMPORTS AND DOMESTIC SOURCES.

THE ORDER--COMPASSIONATE, WITHOUT A DOUBT. ALSO--POLITICALLY WISE. HEADING OFF A MASS ~~DE~~ DEMONSTRATION PLANNED BY LEFTIST LEADERS IN KERALA-- TO PROTEST A RECENT RICE CUT.

BASEBALL

The sport of baseball staggered today -- by a Milwaukee circuit judge, who threw a roadblock in the path of the old Boston Braves -- who later became the Milwaukee Braves -- to keep them from becoming the Atlanta Braves.

The jurist issuing an injunction to require the Braves to play baseball in Milwaukee again this year; instead of in Atlanta as planned. Also, further orders that the National League -- make immediate plans for an expansion that would include Milwaukee -- if the Braves ever do get out of town.

Barring reversal by higher courts -- the injunction to stand pending the outcome of an anti-trust suit -- filed against the Braves by Milwaukee county.

WEATHER
