DULLES FOLLOW MARSHALL F.J. Surroand P.+B. Theo. Apr 2949 In a broadcast merry over many of these only a moment ago, John Foster Dulles, to a Secretary of State Marshall's Republican adviser during the Moscow Conference, gave an account of happenings in the Soviet capitol. Dulles stated that Great Britain and the United States, from now on, will have to achieve by "force of good example" in Europe what they could not "achieve by persuasion" in Moscow.

The G O P expert on foreign affairs echoed Marshall's pessimism of last mitght night. Said he: "Although the American delegation did not go to Moscow with great expectations, we came back with even less than we had expected".

Then he went on to explain **inx** what he meant by "good example", stressing the vital importance of Germany's **Rush** Ruhr industrial area -- its importance to all of Europe, saying that the British and Americans are trying to unite their occupation zones and thus revitalize this essential area for

Western Europe's welfare.

Said he: "It is imperative that our twozone merger be a success. The situation gives us a great **xexpexseilt** responsibility and a great opportunity If our joint administration can pump vitality into western Europe, we will have achieved by force of example what we could not achieve by persuasion in Moscow".

Which was the jist of the report of Foster Dulles, My Chief Mepublican mdm adviser at Moscow. It shows him to be in accord with Secretary of State Marshall; shows that the bi-partisan policy is still working in foreign affairs.

### MARSHALL

Congress is solidly behind Secretary of State Marshall! Legislative leaders lined up today in support of Marshall declarations of last night. Headed by Senators Vandenberg and Barkley, Senate leaders of the Republicans and Democrats respectively, a large majority spoke out in favor of the Marshall formetion, that the western democracies cannot let things drift indefinitely because of Soviet opposition.

Attention is focused on **Cherch Mooshall's** revelation of what Stalin had to say at that headline meeting between the Russian Premier and our Secretary of State - Stalin indicating that the Moscow Conference was only a sort of preliminary skirmish in disputes that would go on until both sides got tired of disputing and then make compromises - "Compromise through exhaustion", as Secretary of State Marshall phrased it. They agreed with him that world affairs cannot be MARSHALL - 2

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At the same time today, the administration foreign program ran into a snag in the House of Representatives. A faction of comparison Republicans and Southern Democrats voted a slash of the appropriation that President Truman wants for general foreign relief. The lower House, by a hundred and fifty-six to a hundred -and-thirty-eight, voted to cut the President's threehundred-and\_fifty million down to two-hundred-million the economy bloc arguing that that was enough to tide the needy nations over until this year's crops are harvested.

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What did the Soviets say to that? Gromyko supported the Arabs; but not all the way. "Many people say, why does the General Assembly, convened in a special session, not desire to consider the substance of the Palestine problem?" So spoke the Soviet delegata Then he added that the U.S.S.R. although in favor of debate on all issues, "Does not necessarily support Abab proposals for an independent Balestine."

The U N steering committee met to plan for the coming Assembly session, but made so little progress that the U N was forced to cancel tomorrow's scheduled meeting of the General Assembly.

In the city of Prague, capital of Czechoslovakia, two wartime paratroopers were hanged today. All over Europe there has been a grizzly series of executions of war criminals, but few of these have presented a story so strange.

It all goes back to that tragic name - Lidice, the town that was wiped out in blood and fire by the Nazis. During the war, Lidice became a symbol of martyrdom. The atrocity was committed as a reprisal for Gestage Ch the assassination of the Nazi tyrant in Azechoslovakia, Heydrich the Hangman. Actually, the people of Lidice had acthing to do with the killing of the Nasi overlord. The Nazis hadn't any idea of the identity of the Czech patriots.who had thrown the bomb and blown up Heydrich the Hangman. They were completely in the dark which takes us to the two former paratroopers who were

executed in Prague today.

They, themselves, were anti-Nazi patriots, Czechs who had got away from the read invader and had made their way to England. There they enlisted in secret units that were being trained to aid the underground resistance in Czechoslovakia. Fighters were to be dropped by parachute into Czechoslovakia, military reinforcement for the Czech underground.

The two Czech fugitives from Nazi tyranny joined up as paratroopers, were thoroughly trained by the British British, and in due time were on their perilous mission members of a parachute unit dropped by planes at night Mumbers of them in Czechoslovakia. There they operated with the Czech

underground.

The assassination of Hitler's Gestapo chief was the doing of these paratroopers. Eight of them took A part in the bombing of the Nazi Hangman, after which the

Czech underground provided them with a secure hiding

place. They were concealed in the crypt of the Russian Orthodox Church in Prague. That ecclesiastical crypt was the number one secret of the Czech underground.

The two who were hanged today knew the secret and what was it that tempted them? What was the lue the communited the two perstroopers, Caech patriots who had enlisted in the perilous mission of joining the anti-Nazi underground? The answer is an old one - money. The Hitler people, baffled in their frantic search for the assassins of Heydrich, put up huge rewards. They broadcast offers of fortunes in money for information about the killers of the Hangman. That was the temptation. The two paratroopers of the underground couldn't resist the lure of sudden wealth. They went secretly to the Nazis, and sold the information - the information pointing to the crypt of the Russian Orthodox Church in

Prague.

When Nazi Storm Troopers raided the crypt, it was a fight to the death - the trapped eight paratroopers resisting to the end.

The two who had betrayed them got the money, and lived high. But their Nemesis came when **Exerchantionney** Czechoslovakia was liberated, and the secrets of the Nazis were disclosed - including the secret of the betrayal of the killers of Hangman Heydrich.- and The Nemesis was today completed with the grim executions at Prague. LABOR

And the people of Java in that sector are called the Sundanese.

They are hostile to the Javanese, and tonight are in open rebellion.

One report from Batavia is that heavy fighting is going on between large native forces, two hundred thousand Sundanese under arms. The word is that the Sundanese have begun with a heavy defeat, losing two divisions of twelve thousand men in battle with the army of the Indonesian Republic. RBut that seems not to have settled the crisis at all - tonight's news giving us a proclamation by the leader of the Sundanese, who declares that his people have a history and a culture of their own, and will not live under the rule of the government that has been set up by the Javanese. WThe Sundanese have called upon the Dutch government for aid, which would now seem to make it a three-cornered conflict in Java - a complication of the Dutch and two

rival groups of native people. They are large groups, too. Java has a population of some forty-one million, and of these twelve million are Sundanese. CHINA

The eyes, nose and mouth have equally significant meanings -- indicating good luck or bad.

So you see the possibilities in plastic surgery. The Chinese have just discovered that a doctor can

change a face around to fit almost any pattern, as prescribed in the fortune telling books. Your particular style of beauty may indicate you'll be poor, and nobody will **minimum** admire you, and you'll have no friends and lots of enemies, that you'll have an unhappy marriage, will have all kinds of ailments and will die young. But a plastic surgeon can fix that --he can change your face into a shining map of good luck, giving it the fortune teller signs of a rich inheritance, universal admiration, a blissful marriage, a wonderful constitution, and a long life.

One rule of physiognomical fortune-telling is that, if the bridge of the nose increases a fraction of an inch after the age of forty, the Chinese god of wealth will look upon that person with much favor. Well, to hike the bridge of the nose about a cuarter of an inch is easy for an experienced face lifter.

An unfailing sign of success -- in a man -- is a wide mouth, which guarantees eminence and fame in one's profession. Maybe a plastic surgeon can do a CHINA - 3

### PALESTINE

In the Palestine debate has before the U.N., Soviet Russia tonight lined up with the Arab states against Great Britain and the United States. The Mexican President flew to the United States in President Truman's personal plane, the Sacred Cow, which was picked up at New Orleans by an escort of fourteen B-29s, and the Superfortresses played the part of attendants of honor all the way to Washington. At the airport, President Truman gave welcome to President Aleman - our chief executive resexpressings reciprocating for the honors with which he was received in Mexico some weeks ago. Then the two Presidents-Mashington evenues liped by cheering proceeded by car spectators. And tonight all the formalities of hospitality are being shown to the visitor from south of the Rio Grande. all of which ceremony is a simple reflection of how important the Republic of Mexico is in the foreign relations of the United States. In the demispheric good-neighbor policy, what could be more importand than our next door neighbor to the south?

Attempts to settle the telephone strike have broken down again. A collective bargaining conference, called by the government, ran into **quix** a quick deadlock today - when the telephone companies refused to concede a wage increase as a preliminary to a settlement.

It was a stormy meeting, in which the Union is said to have called for an immediate six-dollar-a-week increase for the strikers. That refused, the Union leaders stalked out, charging angrily that the Company had, in his words, "refused to bargain." To this, the Company spokesman retorts by saying: we countered by telling him that we were ready and willing to arbitrate wages. We don't consider to make a cash offer, a refusal to bargain."

The federal conciliator insists that the negotiations have not collapsed, and says he'll try to

get the Company and Union representatives together for a continuation of the conference.
