*An estimated three and a half million Egyptians - arriving by camel, donkey, ox cart, and on foot; cheering the President and Egypt's Anwar Sadat as they journeyed by train from Cairo to Alexandria. The chant of "Nix-on!" "Nix-on!" following the President all the way. At times - drowning out - even the clatter of the ancient train.*

*The President appearing almost stunned -by the size and warmth of his welcome, and saying - he was overwhelmed.*

*The two Presidents held additional talks today - as*

*well as a news conference at which Mr. Nixon said: "I don't want to over-promise. There are no instant solutions."*

*He stressed that - "We will deal realistically with the problems" - case by case. Sadat adding that the most important thing now - is to "keep the momentum going."*

*Tonight in Alexandria - an all-American dinner was hosted by President Nixon who told how President Sadat will visit us some time before the end of the year.*

## NEW ORLEANS
