Reports from Havana state that Fidel Castro - is back in the mountains. This time facing - a dangerous threat to his own dictatorship. A company of his own troops - rising in rebellion. Taking to the hills with the arms and ammunition he supplied from his store of Communist weapons.

Guerrilla warfare - in Central Cuba with Castro, desperately trying to round them up - before any more of his soldiers do the same. PATROL

President Eisenhower today called off our patrol of the Caribbean - a sign that the emergency is over. Meaning - Guatemala and Nicaragua have ridden out Chany rate they their political crisis. Say they are no longer afraid of a Communist invasion from Cuba.

The American patrol along the coast of Central America - began on November Seventeenth. It was intended as a blunt warning to Castro - to leave his Caribbean neighbors alone. The Cuban dictator - apparently got the idea. Especially after the riots he fomented in Central America - www.were put down by the legitimate governments.

The Caribbean, so quiet - at least for the moment ---that President Eisenhower orders our flotilla waxe back to base. CONGO

Jugoslavia's latest action at the UN - is sure to hamper the Secretary-General. Tito, refusing to back Dag Hammerskjold - on the Congo. The Jugoslav dictator - calling home his de soldiers - who comprise part of the UN force in Leopoldville. Weakening the UN - in the Congo. Also - in New York.

This - just when the U N army is needed more than ever. Today, Mobutu rushed his troops into the jungle - to attack Lumumba's followers, who are in open rebellion.

NEW ORLEANS

Integration had a set back - in New Orleans today. White attendance at William Frantz school dropped for the first time in a week. Yesterday, twenty four white children - were in class. Today - only nineteen. Those who stayed home, apparently kept there by **in** their parents, who were afraid of the **EDNIN** continuing violence. That case of vandalism - at the home of the Reverend Andrew Foreman.

Meanwhile, Louisiana segregationists have again appealed - to the Supreme Court. Again asking our highest tribunal - to stay the integration of public scheels in New Orleans. HOFFA

When the head of the Teamsters Union entered Chicago's federal building - newsmen bombarded him with questions. But Jimmy Hoffa didn't have - many answers. He kept repeating one sentence - "we'll try the case me in court." Then he surrendered to the District Attorney. Jimmy Hoffa - indicted for misusing union funds. The charge is that the Teamster boss put the money - into a Florida real me estate scheme.

KENNEDY

Our next Secretary of the Interior will be the first Arizonian - ever to sit in a presidential cabinet. Congressman Stewart Udall - selected for the job by the President elect. Udall told a news conference he'll be particularly concerned with - conservation, national parks, and Indian affairs. All of which he's handled before - as Democratic Congressman from Arizona. What about the rest of the Kennedy Cabinet? Senator Kennedy today decrare he hasn't set any

deadline for new appointments. He's taking his time, looking on both sides of the political fence - trying to come up with the best team he can assemble.

Today Mr. Kennedy was Ruriously active in he with New York, Mustling - from one place to another; - MR breakfasting ~ with the Secretary General of the U N;-lunching with the British Ambassador to the U N;- the news conference -- at which the MXX Udall appointment was announced. And a series of conferences - with leaders of both parties.
