Speaking ~~for~~ for the Republicans - President Nixon - and then -- for the Democrats, Senator Muskie of Maine.

The President's address - scheduled as a replay of the speech he made Saturday night in Phoenix, the one branding ~~appeasement~~ appeasement as the prime cause of violent demonstrations ^{here at home, and} ~~clear across the land, further~~ calling for the election of Senate and House members - who will take a "tough minded approach to violence."

The President also challenging those who say - "everybody is against violence ^{that} - it's not an issue." The President ^{says} ~~declaring~~ "it is an issue - one of the central issues in American life today."

Senator Muskie in turn, pledging to respond to what

he call^S~~ed~~ - "Republican tactics of fear ~~and~~ and division;"
^
tactics "which threaten" - said he - "to tear this country
apart."

NEW YORK

The former First Lady - Lady Bird Johnson - the main guest on a TV program taped in New York for showing tonight. Among other things, Mrs. Johnson discussing press coverage of the White House - during the time that L B J was president; contending that newsmen had not really been fair - because "they talked more of the small, bad things - than the larger constructive things." The former First Lady noting, for example, ^{how} "they were more likely to notice the wart on your nose - than the fact that you were signing a civil rights bill."

BOSTON

Up at Boston - death came today to the celebrated common man's Prince of the Roman Catholic Church. Cardinal Richard Cushing - the son of an immigrant Irish blacksmith who never forgot his humble beginnings - passing away after a lengthy illness.

Cardinal Cushing first becoming known to millions of Americans - as a confidante of the powerful Kennedy Clan. Later playing a prominent role - in reshaping the Catholic Church via the Vatican and the Ecumenical Council. Along the way, endearing himself to his flock - by his jaunty informality; also, raising millions - for church as well as non-church causes.

Now the end - less than a month since his retirement. Cardinal Richard Cushing aged seventy-five.

LONDON

An ominous story - reported today from London. The Russians supposedly intercepting ~~ka~~ and blowing up recently - one of their own sputniks. This according to Kenneth Gatland - a Vice President of the British Interplanetary Society - who says the feat was accomplished by sending up a second sputnik triggered to explode at just the right time and place in space. This a first step - we are told - in developing a new anti-satellite system; one that could be used apparently - in knocking out America's so-called "spy in the sky" satellites.

HELSINKI

Helsinki, Finland. U S and Russian diplomats toasting each other in champagne as the highlight of a brief ceremony - opening the third round of Strategic Arms Limitations talks. Gerard Smith for the U S - expressing hope that the Salt Talks will soon result in "agreed verifiable arrangements." But they still seem to have a long way to go.

PARROT'S BEAK

The war news from Southeast Asia tells today of a series of battles - in the Parrot's Beak region of Cambodia, just across the border from South Vietnam. Saigon troops - who have been sweeping the area - reporting they killed more than a hundred of the enemy.

Reverse side - Communist gunners ~~today~~ subjecting the ~~great~~ city of Saigon - to its first rocket attack in weeks. Enemy shells killing at least seven, two of whom were ~~just~~ children.

UNITED NATIONS

At the United Nations - in New York - Britain's
Sir Colin Crowe today urged the Arabs and Israelis -
to negotiate a new package deal; One that would call
for an Arab commitment to the cause of peace - coupled
with an Israeli withdrawal from conquered Arab lands.

~~Sir Colin adding that such a deal could be endorsed
by the U N Security Council - and then supervised by
U N personnel; always bearing in mind - said he -
that "these elements are of equal importance; ^{since} ~~and~~ one
cannot be taken without the other."~~

RIGHTS FOLLOW UNITED NATIONS

At the same time - a special three nation committee was filing a report today with the ~~U~~ U N General Assembly - a reporting accusing the Israelis - of violating the human rights of Arabs living in occupied territory. However, Israel promptly rejecting the accusation - calling it "an organized propaganda exercise wanting in minimal judicial gurantees."

STRIKE

~~Overseas~~ again - Britain's "dirty jobs" strike entered its sixth week today; with Londoners walking the streets amid ~~the~~ piles of uncollected garbage in some cases higher than their heads.

One oasis though in the sea of clutter - number Ten Downing Street where the Lady Caroline French Blake - nineteen year old daughter of the Duke of Saint Albans - gathered together a volunteer clean-up crew. Lady Caroline saying "we don't think ~~that~~ people coming to see the Prime Minister - should have to wade through all this rubbish." Economist Patrick Evershed - who helped out - adding: "Our action was a demonstration of patriotism - and a demonstration against industrial anarchy."
