The testimony of the Warren Commission runs to -- as you may have heard -- twenty-six volumes; weighs fifty-four pounds; and went on sale today at the Government Printing Office for seventy-six dollars.

In it the complete transcription of the tessmony regarding the assassination of President Kennedy. The testimony that led to the conclusion -- that Lee Harvey Oswald fired the shorts that hit the President.

One of the most important witnesses -- Lyndon Johnson -- who says that he heard the shots, but had no idea what was happening -- because a secret service agent immediately pushed him down in the car, and sat on him -- until they were out of the area.

The Vice President -- following the presidential care without realizing that within minutes -- he would

be President of the United States.

But the really harrowing testimony came from - those in the Presidential car. Governor Connally, Mrs. Connally and Mrs. Kennedy, Especially - Mrs. Kennedy. We already knew how her husband slumped over - with his head in her lap. But even so, there's a profound poignance - in reading again about the ordeal of the then First Lady.

The poignance will always be there - in this testimony before the Warren Commission. The most authoritative source of information - about that fatal day in Dallas, a year ago.

TAYLOR

The State Department in Washington agrees with what General Maxwell Taylor is saying - in Saigon. Namely - that the war against the Red Guerrillas is not going well, And that the war might have to be extended - to North Viet Nam. At least in the form of air strikes - at Communist staging areas.

The Taylor statement is in an interview he gave to "Life Magazine." Our Ambassador to South Viet Nam, speaking with the bluntness - of an soldier. Declaring that - "a great battle has been joined." A battle that could swing in our favor - should we strafe the bases to the north. Eliminate the privileged sanctuary - from which the guerrillas infiltrate South Viet Nam.

See. Maxwell Taylor takes a more pessimistic view of the situation - than his civilian and military advisors. But the State Department does not object to - this kind of pessimism. A spokesman for the Department, telling newsmen - "General Taylor let us know in advance what he was going to say."

VIET NAM

Buddhist and Catholic leaders in South Viet Nam, who do not always agree with each other, both say emphatically that these continuing anti-government riots in their country -- are Communist inspired. The religious leaders charging that agitators - who are really Communist saboteurs - are using the names of Catholic and Buddhist associations to whip up the riots. The Defense Ministry in Saigon - says much the same thing. It reports that troops have had to fire twice - on mobs in the central coastal province of Phu Yen. Killing two people and wounding ten. The riots inspired axh by - Communist agitators.

Meanwhile Prime Minister Tran Van Huong blasted what he called "dissatisfied politicians" - for fomenting the riots. And made it quite clear - he did not intend to let his new civilian government fall, Enless - it is voted out of office constitutionally. He is going ahead with his plan - to take their draft exemption away from student agitators, And keep them busy - in the army. A plan which many observers think - might have more effect than bayonets and tear gas.

CONGO

California - would be a nervous wreck by now Except for - his religious faith. His colleagues insist that the American medical missionary has the kind of faith - of which Saint Paul speaks. That he mustbe one of the least worried - by his captivity. The least fearful of the repeated threats - to execute him.

Once more - the execution has been postponed. The Congolese rebels, bowing to a plea by - Kenya's Premier Jomo Kenyatta. A humanitarian appeal from the African leader once known as - the "Burning Spear" of the Mau-Mau.

Meanwhile, the danger to all the Americans and Europeans behind the rebel lines - is greater than ever. Premier Tshombe repeats - that his army will continue the advance toward Stanleyville. Radio Stanleyville repeats that unless the advance is halted, all of the hostages will be executed.
