Leone's response in the same vein. "The vast urgency of the task - requires a global answer" - said he. Adding: "We must study and tackle the great economic problems - which beset the world."

Meanwhile, the latest government in Lebanon collapsing today after only fifteen months in power.

Adding that he expects to have "as much power, responsibility and authority" -as the President wants him to have. "And that" - said he - "is the way it should be."
