WARSAW

*For President Ford - a gala reception today in Warsaw. The President touring the city - with Polish-Communist Party Leader Edward Gierek; who noted how Warsaw had "been restored to life, beautiful and modern" - from the rubble of World War Two; and hoping there will be "no more war."*

*The peace theme dominates a joint statement.*

## CAPITAL HILL

*On Capitol Hill - the house today accepted overwhelmingly - a Senate passed seven year extension of the voting rights act of nineteen-sixty-five. The bill now goes to the White House where President Ford is expected to sign it first thing on his return from Europe.*

*The House also joined the Senate today - in voting most favored trade status to Communist Romania - the first of the iron curtain countries - to be granted that privilege.*

## ECONOMY

*The U.S. Trade surplus in June - an all time record high; more than one point seven billion. This according to figures released today; due mainly we are told, to sharp cut back in oil imports.*

*However we also hear that the Federal deficit in fiscal Seventy-Five - was more than Forty-Four Billion; the nation's highest deficit since the end of World War Two.*

## ATLANTA

However during a visit to New York today Ted Kennedy said emphatically that he will not be a candidate. Adding: "I have made my stand absolutely clear - I have said it over and over again."*

*Here in Colorado - a major letter writing campaign is under way. Friends and colleagues of former Colorado Governor John Vanderhoof are urging his appointment as new Secretary of the Interior. Vanderhoof - from his home in Grand Junction, Colorado, says he's not really sure he would accept such a post. The former Governor explaining it's difficult to think of living in Washington - when the fish are biting in Western Colorado, As they are these days.*
