SARA

At San Francisco - the woman who fired on President Ford yesterday was arraigned in Federal court. Sara Jane Moore then ordered taken to the San Diego correctional center - to undergo a sixty day psychiatric test.

We hear she attempted to have herself placed in police custody; saying she might be forced to seek out the President - and, quote, "test the system," whatever she meant by that.

SAN FRANCISCO

denied bail today a second time. The judge in the case ordering ~~first~~ a full mental examination by three court appointed psychiatrists, ~~the~~ following an indication from Miss Hearst's attorney - that he intends to argue ^{that} she is not "mentally competent".

In talks with newsmen - ~~defence~~ defence counsel going even further; saying Miss Hearst "was insane - during the entire time she was kidnapped;" and adding "right now - she is on the verge of tipping one way or the other - and that's what we are worried about."

AFFIDAVIT

An affidavit from ~~Miss~~ Miss Hearst herself was also filed with the court - and excerpts were published simultaneously in the San Francisco Chronicle, ~~the~~ ~~San Francisco~~ newspaper. The defendant telling how she was kidnapped, - in effect, "brain-ashed" by members of the Symbionese Liberation army - and then forced at the point of a gun to take part in a San Francisco bank robbery. Miss Hearst adding she has "lived in a fog," Since then - "confused, still unable to distinguish between actuality and fantasy - and in a perpetual state of terror."

At the White House - President Ford again served notice today - he will not allow himself to become a "prisoner in the oval office;" that to do so would be to capitulate to those he earlier described as "the wrong elements," ^{as he put it,} "the infinitesimal number who want to destroy ~~me~~ everything that is best about America."

The President's views ^{were} ~~were~~ relayed by a White House spokesman who also said the President's stand on illegal use of guns - remains the same, to wit: "Certain prison sentences - for those who use guns in the commission of a crime."
