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NIXON

Whistle-stopping through Pennsylvania today -Vice President Nixon stepped up his attacks on Senator Kennedy. The Republican standard bearer, repeating the charge that his opponent is "immature", and going on to say - that "Kennedy is the kind of man that Khrushchev could make mince meat of." The Vice President told his Pennsylvania audiences that Kennedy is wrong on a whole series of foreign problems-Cuba, the off-shore islands, the U-2 incident, and so on.

Turning to religion, Nixon said - "he doesn't want to raise it as an issue. But, he may have to if Jack Kennedy doesn't do something about his younger brother. The reference concerns Robert Kennedy's **AX** accusation - that Republican headquarters are turningput anti-Catholic propaganda.

On domestic problems- Nixon again ridiculed Kennedy's economic program. Nixon argued that Kennedy hasn't thought out the ways and means of financing the program. Nixon estimates that Fifteen billion would be added to the federal budget - and the demands to know where the the Democrats figure they can find that kind of money.

KENNEDY

The Democratic candidate today was welcomed by enthusiastic crowds - as he toured the mid-west. Ten thousand jammed into Peoria's court house square - to hear Senator Kennedy call for a fresh approach to world problems. As Kennedy put it - "a new generation of Americans is going to lead this country."

All day long, Kennedy was hitting hard - at the farm problem. Charging that the Republicans don't care about the low level of farm income, Ør unemployment, throughout the agricultural areas.

Kennedy's economic program? He repeats that America is rich enough - to afford the social services he wants. Especially - extending social security to cover medical care for the aged. Charging that the Republicans have tried to wreck Social Security, Kennedy stated flatly "I believe, Mr. Nixon has lead that wrecking crew." Tonight the Kennedy camp says they are optimistic because their man has been pulling big turnouts - in traditionally Republican strongholds of Illinois.

EISENHOWER

Today, President Eisenhower was met with shouts of "bravo!" And, "Viva Ike". The traditional greeting of Mexico, as our Chief executive crossed the Rio Grande - to meet Mexico's President Mateos in Ciudad Acuna.

Thousands of Mexicans came out for the occasion in spite of a heavy rain. They cheered themselves hoarse as President Eisenhower and President Mateos - embraced warmly in Latin American fashion. They swarmed into the square before the old Spanish City Hall - to hear Mr. Eisenhower fore-tell coming prosperity for both nations; Prosperity based on the Armistad Dam, which is going to be built - to harness the waters of the Rio Grande.

The cheers in Ciudad Acuna became thunderous when Eisenhower and Mateos pledged - "indestructible Mexican-American friendship." CONGO

Tonight the capital of the Congo is on the verge of complete anarchy. Congolese soldiers are rampaging through Leopoldville - hunting down supporters of Lumumba. Whiteh (parently Mobutu's control of his troops, - is obviously)

slipping fast.

Meanwhile, the U N is caught - in a cross-fire. And, on U N Day, In Leopoldville, only two hundred Africans - most of them children - turned out for the parade. In secessionist Katanga province the parade had to be cancelled.

IDEOLOGY

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British experts on Communism are convinced that the ideological dispute bit between Russia and Red China is as bitter as ever. This, in spite of the cable is from Mao Tse Tung to Khrushchev - acknowledging is Soviet leadership of the Communist bloc.

The London analysists point out - that the cable is not a state document. It's merely a polite reply to Moscow congratulations - on the eleventh anniversary of the Communist #revolution in China. But no high ranking Soviet Minister turned up in Peking to take part in the celebration. Nor has Mao ceased to compete with Khrushchev - for influence in the uncommitted areas of the world. Especially - the newly iterrate liberated nations of Africa.

Why the assertion of monolithic unity - in the Red camp? The best guess is that Mao and Khrushchev are trying to present a common front to the West - even which while they are engaged in a deadly struggle for power behind the Iron Curtain.

FRANCE

France is ready to join with Britain and America - in a common plan for using nuclear weapons. So says Paris Foreign Minister, Couve de Murville. But, there's a catch. DeGaulle's Foreign Minister adds that the French will cooperate - only after they have for created atomic their own striking force. of atomic arms, They intend to hold off - until they can bargain on a level of equality with their allies. GOLD

The London gold rush - is still on. In fact, it's becoming something of a frenzy. Thousands of pounds changing hands - in a few hours.

Our government has promised to hold the line on gold - at thirty-five dollars an ounce. But on the London exchange, the precious/metal is selling at forty dollars an ounce. All of the gamblers - trying to an get some. The reason?-They believe the Dollar is about to be devalued. So, there's a finm financial band wagon - rolling furiously in the British capital. The London gold rush.

PALEONTOLOGY

How is the weather where you are? Where I am it's ⁹32; we've just had three inches of new snow today; trees all deep in snow like in mid-Winter; it's still snowing - and the date only October 24.

But here's an interesting weather report about sub-tropical conditions in northern Canada in October. It's a legitimate weather report issued by Professor Andrew McNair of Dartmouth. The catch being - that Professor McNair is head of the Dartmouth Paleontology Department. So he specializes in - pre-historic rocks and fossils; and he's referring to North American-fifty million years ago.

Professor McNair has just returned from an expedition to Northern Canada - where he and his men gathered thousands of fossils beneath the Arctic tundra. Among the fossils - reptiles, warm water fish, and tropical lants. Proving that Canada once had - a

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climate like Brazil. Fifty million years ago - Dick when there weren't any Canadians around to say they were feeling the heat. Canada then like Brazil now. CHURCHILL

Randolph Churchill is suing a member of Parliament - for calling him a coward. Gerald Nabarro used the epithet at the time of the Suez invasion. That was just after Randolph Churchill - had attacked Prime Minister Anthony Eden. Whereupon, M. P. Nabarro came charging to the rescue. Arguing that Eden was in no position - to defend himself. So his assailant had no fear - of a counter attack. Nabarro's argument caused him to connect the name Churchill -- with the word "coward".

The case has now reached - a London court Foday Randolph Churchill's lawyer said that his client - would prefer an old fashioned methods. A duel - in the eighteenth

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Century manner. Or perhaps a round of fisticuffs, as in the Nineteenth Century.

But this is the Twentieth Century - and the plaintiff can't do anything more violent than ask for a court room verdict in his favor. Rat Randolph Churchill,who thinks that the M P should be make made to pay up for -calling him a coward.
