By a vote of thirty-one to six - the initial hearing

remained

then closed. The committee removing hundreds of reporters

and TV and radio newsmen - along with a handful of private

citizens.

Meanwhile, the President was coming under increasing criticism - from a number of top Republicans; among them, Vice President Gerald Ford, House Republican Leader John Rhodes, - and Congressman Anderson of Illinois, the chairman of the House Republican Conference.

Anderson going so far as to say as the question now - is "which of the two alternatives will become fact;" impeachment - or resignation.

Over at the White House though - an aide to the

President saying he will not quit - "even if hell freezes

over." The President himself - proceeding with business

more or less as usual; meeting with Republican

Congressional leaders for two hours - to discuss the state

of the economy. The President predicting "real relief

ahead" - in the prices of food and fuel.

Kelley today held a rare news conference; along the way, saying "it has not yet been proved" to him - that Patricia Hearst was a "voluntary participant" in criminal activities.

Kelley adding that the FBI would "make every effort - not to hurt anyone;" but, "if it is determined where she is in the future" - said he - "we are going to go in" and get her.
