VIETNAM

Reports from Saigon say American military leaders are urging the Pentagon to go ahead with plans to construct some kind of defense barrier bem between North and South Vietnam. The British government, so angered by the report that
Foreign Secretary George Brown sent Peking a personal
note of protest. At the same time, the Chinese hinted
at a possible diplomatic break with London.

Mobs of Red Guards are also besieging the
Soi Soviet Embassy in Peking in new demonstrations
against Soviet "revisionism."
