*Thurgood Marshall has won Senate confirmation as the first negro Supreme Court Justice in the nation's history. The roll-call vote - sixty-nine for and eleven against - came after several southern Senators delivered speeches opposing confirmation of Marshall, the U S Solicitor General whose legal victories include the historic Supreme Court decision outlawing school segregation.*

# ROMNEY

Republican Governor ~~George~~ Romney of Michigan

charged today that the "country is in a real economic and financial mess," And ~~he~~ predicts President Johnson will

have a "difficult battle on his hands ~~in~~ trying to win

re-election." *At the same time he* ~~but Romney~~ refused to make any commitment

regarding his own aspirations as a presidential candidate.

## VIETNAM

*Reports from Saigon say American military leaders are urging the Pentagon to go ahead with plans to construct some kind of defense barrier ~~between~~ between North and South Vietnam. Such a barrier to extend forty-three miles along the demilitarized zone from Laos to the South China Sea. A South East Asia Maginot Line? Purpose to choke off the movement of Communist troops and war supplies from the North into the South. Let's see, centuries ago they built the Great Wall of China, for a similar ~~an~~ purpose. Like the Maginot Line it was futile.*

*Meanwhile the Viet Cong in one of their more daring raids of the war - blasted their way into a jail at Quang Ngai and freed nearly a thousand prisoners.*

# KOREA

Three American soldiers have been killed -

five wounded - by Communist land mine traps along the  
demilitarized zone in Korea. ~~It was~~ <sup>This</sup> the fourth and fifth  
in a series of similar incidents this week in ~~the~~ <sup>at</sup> tense  
zone ~~which~~ <sup>ing</sup> divides north and south Korea.



## CHINESE

*The British Foreign Office says its chief diplomat in Peking - Donald Hopson - was seized today by Chinese Red Guards who forced him to bow in humiliation and <sup>also</sup> tried to cut off his hair. The ~~the~~ entire staff of the British Embassy is under virtual house arrest. The British government, so angered by the report that Foreign Secretary George Brown sent Peking a personal note of protest. At the same time, the Chinese hinted at a possible diplomatic break with London.*

*Mobs of Red Guards are also besieging the ~~Soviet~~ Soviet Embassy in Peking in new demonstrations against Soviet "revisionism."*

## HONG KONG

A screaming mob of Chinese demonstrators rushed through the streets of Hong Kong tonight, <sup>with</sup> ~~and~~ police <sup>using</sup> ~~used~~ riot guns and revolvers to drive them back. The second straight night of violence in the Crown Colony where the Communists are <sup>still at it</sup> ~~are~~ trying to undermine British authority.

## DALAI LAMA

From Tokyo tonight comes word that the spiritual leader of Tibet - the Dalai Lama - will visit Japan next month. It will be the first break in the thirty-two year old former ruler's eight year exile in India where he has been living <sup>at Dharmasala, his</sup> ~~in a~~ Himalayan retreat. He plans to leave Calcutta aboard ~~a jet~~ <sup>an</sup> airliner and arrive in Tokyo on September twenty-fifth. There's no official word as to the purpose of the Dalai Lama's visit to Japan - but he reportedly will bring with him about two hundred fifty Tibetan treasures for an exhibition sponsored by a Japanese newspaper.

The Dalai Lama <sup>is</sup> ~~is~~ fourteenth in the line that began five hundred years ago - ~~is himself Chinese born~~ Tibetan theological experts ordained him as ruler after he passed a series of tests, convincing them he was the God-King. The Dalai Lama ruled <sup>in Lhasa at the fabulous Potala,</sup> ~~at Potala Palace in~~ Lhasa for twenty years before he was forced to flee when the Chinese Communists <sup>overran</sup> ~~took over~~ Tibet.

As you ~~have known, the Dalai Lama~~ a young man,

~~who~~ is as important to millions of Buddhists as the Pope

is to the Catholics, ~~has been living in exile now ever since~~

he and thousands of his countrymen fled across the

Himalayas to India in Nineteen Fifty-Nine. That was when

Mao Tse Tung's troops moved in. Ever since then the

Chinese Reds have ruled Tibet with an iron hand, as much

of it as they are able to control.

The fiercest warriors among the Tibetans are the

men from Kham. These Khambas have ~~xx~~ never given up.

In the vastness of the Himalayas, in Southeastern Tibet, they continue to wage guerrilla warfare. The Khamba horsemen even go on raids to other parts of Tibet hundreds of miles away. ~~Tibet is not a small country.~~ <sup>In fact</sup> ~~The Tibetans~~ <sup>people</sup> live ~~spread out over~~ <sup>an area</sup> ~~part of~~ of Central Asia ~~almost~~ more than half the size of the United States.

~~The Fourteenth Dalai Lama, direct in succession to a D L who ascended the Tibetan Buddhist Papal throne five centuries ago, is now approaching middle age. When~~ <sup>the Alaska Lowell</sup> ~~my son~~ and I crossed the Himalayas and had an audience with him in 1949, he was in his teens, and already gave indication of being a most unusual person. <sup>The</sup> ~~The~~ <sup>scholarly</sup> training, the training in memory that a Dalai Lama receives is beyond anything received by anyone in any other country so far as I know.

~~In recent months the people of India feel as though they have been insulted over and over by Peking. As a result, the word has come from India~~

~~that the Dalai Lama may be permitted to make granted his~~

~~wish, may be allowed to fly to South America, and visit,~~

the United Nations? If he does that could be ~~one of the~~

## FLOTILLA

The State Department is trying to discourage Cuban exile plans to organize a flotilla of ~~about~~ two hundred ships ~~that would~~ <sup>to</sup> sail to Cuba next month in an effort to win freedom for political prisoners. While the State Department sympathizes with the purpose, it doesn't believe the flotilla would succeed, ~~in bringing back any~~

lies at the bottom of the sea. The <sup>great Cunard liner</sup> ~~mighty passenger liner~~

has been there since May seventh, Nineteen Fifteen when

she was sunk by a German torpedo, <sup>along with</sup> ~~carrying~~ more than

thousand passengers <sup>who went</sup> to their deaths in one of the great

sea disasters of history. Some believe the <sup>Lusitania</sup> ~~passenger liner~~

was carrying gold bullion in its hold. ~~Twice since that~~

<sup>up to now</sup> ~~many~~ salvage missions <sup>have been</sup> ~~were~~ unsuccessful - <sup>but</sup> ~~now~~ now a

A spokesman for the American Nazis says the body of the party's slain leader - George Lincoln Rockwell - has been cremated and the ashes are being kept in an urn at the party's headquarters in Arlington, Virginia. Shortly after the announcement, memorial ceremonies were held at the headquarters with only ~~close~~ friends and followers of Rockwell in attendance. "Newsmen ~~were~~ kept out by two carbine-carrying storm-troopers."

## ALGERIA

*Algerian President Boumedienne nationalized five American-operated oil companies in Algeria today by decree. His government also promised to pay indemnities to the American companies but the amount was not specified. That, the government said, would be determined later - also by decree.*

*In an apparent warning to the Arab summit conference in progress at Khartoum, which he is boycotting, Boumedienne called for a new Arab war against Israel. He says ninety-nine percent of the Arab masses reject a political settlement to the Middle East crisis.*

YUGO

President Tito of Yugoslavia sent his Foreign Minister to Washington today - seeking President Johnson's support for a compromise plan to end the Arab-Israeli deadlock in the Middle East. Tito's plan calls for withdrawal of Israeli forces from the territory occupied last June, the re-establishment of a U N peace force along the frontiers, and big power guarantees for a return to the previous borders between Israel and the Arab states - proposals *not likely to meet with cheers in* ~~which hardly will find any favor in~~ Tel Aviv and Jerusalem
