INDOCHINA

War news from Southeast Asia includes today a reported pull-back by those same Communist troops who earlier over-ran the Plain of Jars in Northern Laos. A pull-back made necessary - we are told because of heavy monsoon rains said to be playing havoc with enemy supply lines.
