Today, Mr. K. put on one of his best acts - playing the part of farmer Khrushchev. Having a rare agricultural time - on the rich are acres of Roswell Garst, at Coon Rapids, Iowa. Garst, a friend who has visited him in Moscow.

At luncheon, in a big tent outside the farmhouse Khrushchev met Adlai Stevenson, and had a talk with the twotime unsuccessful candidate for the presidency. Nikita later telling reporters a bit of what they talked about.

He said, Adlai described himself as a "politician in retirement."

Khrushchev answering that by saying: "In politics, it often happens, that the person who may be retired, will be tomorrow - in the very frontranks."

"It is a question" replied Adlai, "of how many times you can be retired."

But the most curious turn of the Khrushchev conversation today - concerned religion. In California, he talked in terms of christianity. Referring - to the Saviour.

Today, he congratulated American farmers in these words:

"I must admit" said Khrushchev, "that you are intelligent people. God has helped you."

"You're right," farmer Garst replied. "God is on our side."

To which Khrushchev retorted: "God is on our side too."

Peculiar talk for a Communist - and using an old that Today must have caused phrase, you can hear Karl Marxoturning over in his grave.

Earlier in the day, at Des Moines, a Lithuanian couple asked Khrushchev to help them get their two children to the United States. Children - they had left behind in Soviet Russia.

Khrushchev pake patted the cheek of the tearful mother, was and said: "Don't cry, you'll get your children".

Then he turned to Soviet Foreign Minister Gromyko, who was with him, and said, "Take care of this."

Our national space and rocket program - turned over, entirely, to the Air Force. The Army and Navy - out of the rocket business. So announced by the Defense Department in Washington, today.

At Manchester, a conservative party rally, which began - www with the singing of popular songs. Popular, that is - in Britain. Today's news dispatch tells how they gave a rousing rendition of a ballad called - "does your chewing gum lose its favor on the bedpost over night?"

A drop in the cost of living - the first in six months. Government figures showing - that prices in August declined by one percent, compared with prices in July.

The drop - mostly in the cost of groceries, food. Which offset a slight increase in the price of other items, like clothing and transportation.

In Cleveland, a fantastic attempt - at bank robbery.

At home, however, Mrs. Fox had managed to get free of her bonds, and call the police. Who arrived on the scene - to find that a motorcycle patrolman had already stumbled onto

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the robbery, and was exchanging shots with the bandit.

There was shooting all over the place. The police - using tear gas bombs. The mm bandit inside - holding the manager and other employees as hostages. Then, finally, the robber shouted - he'd release the hostages. Which he did - and they came out.

When the police entered, they found the bandit shot to death - a suicide. His companion, the blonde, had vanished.

At the Fox home, the police investigated the suitcase, containing the alleged bomb - finding it as was a harmless arrangement of clock, wires and batteries. The apparent explosive - turning out to be coal dust.

Then, still in the hypnotic trance, she was in heaven. The psychiatrist - questioning her about the alleged mak murder of her daughter. The hypnotized woman in heaven still repeating - that she was innocent.

Surprise of surprises - in baseball. The Cleveland Indians, today, signed a manager for next year - and you'd never guess who. Joe Gordon - who managed the team all season, and was ousted yesterday. Fired, - now re-hired.

For days the sports pages have been full of the feud between Gordon and General Manager Frank Lane. With Lane & criticizing Gordon for the way he handled the team.

Gordon retorting - that Lane was second guessing him. So the opinion was - that Gordon would keep his job, only if the Cleveland Indians won the pennant, in their uphill battle - with the White Sox.

Last night they were eliminated by the White Sox; and it was no surprise - when the news came that Joe Gordon had been ousted as manager. Dropped for the last few games of the season.

Today, however, Lane said: "We couldn't think of anybody better to succeed Gordon - than Gordon himself."

The explanation is given - that the feuding between

the two was just a clash of strong minded people in the middle of a hot pennant race. So, Joe Gordon not only keeps his job - but gets a raise.

High indignation in Chicago - about the baseball events last night. True, the White Sox clinched the pennant - and Chicago is wildly enthusiastic about their modern hitless wonders. The indignation today - emanates from the local directors of Civil Defense, who are in charge of precautions against air raids.

the air raid sirens to be turned on, as part of the

Today, the Civil Defense Director said: "I am very much incensed about this." They're looking up the law - to see if there's any ground for prosecution.
