ballot on May Eleven. A chap by the name Peteris Taurine -
minus running as a delegate committed to the nomination of/Richard Nixon for President. Taurins saying he wants to give Nebraskans a chance to protest what he called "Richard Noon's martyrdom by the media."
In eastern Kentucky, near Partridge, eleven more
men perished today - in the same mine wherefiften were killed earlier in the week. The victims today, including three Federal mine inspectors who with the help of others were attempting to determine the cause of the first tragedy - when they, too, were caught in an underground explosion.

Ting, as you may recall, was the target of rabid Maoists during China's "cultural revolution" and again in recent weeks. But now he is said to have paid a visit to a Peking University to read some of the wall posters criticizing his conduct. A Chinese source is quoted as saying this "is interpreted as a sign of
repentance - even a determination to listen frankly to the masses."

## Rebel Army officers in Beirut today established a

 military command council - to serve as an interim government for Lebanon pending new elections. Meanwhile Lebanon's President Franjieh, is refusing to resign.Israeli meanwhile, has its troops on full alert
along its seventy -two mile border with Lebanon.

## LAGOS

The government of Nigeria today announced the public execution of thirty-two men - who allegedly took part in an abortive coup last month. The plotters split into two groups, apparently the better to be seen - then machined gunned to death before thousands of chanting natives.

## LUGGAGE

Here at home again - the FAA today announced plans to begin a search of all checked airline luggage, starting April Fifteen. Officials saying this should "contribute significantly" - to reducing the possibility of any bombs being put on planes.

STOCKHOLM

At Stockholm - one of the world's most eligible bachelors has made the big decision. Sweden's Twenty-Nine year old King, Carl Gustaf - announcing plans to marry a commoner - and a foreigner at that: Silvia Sommerlath - age Thirty -two - the daughter of West German businessman.
