INDIA

However, in spite of the Indian Army debacle, in spite of the way the Chinese have humiliated India, Nehru still remains a popular idol, the most important person in India; and the chances are he will stay on as Prime Minister until illness or old age brings him to the end of his reign.

Who is there on the horizon to succeed him?

One name I heard repeated over and over is an Indian who long years ago came to this country, was educated at the University of Wisconsin, and while here became a follower of Karl Marx. He was so far to the left he even considered Mahatma Ghandi a reactionary and a

His name, Jaya Prakash Narayan. For some years now he has been the leader of a movement called Sarvodaya. Translated that means: the good of all. His followers call him J.P.

Nehru is now seventy-four years old, and not in good health. Jaya Prakash Narayan is sixty, and that's old for India, where the death rate is high. In 1942 the British put him in prison. He escaped, fled to Nepal; then returned to work with the underground. The British put him in prison again, where he remained until Nineteen Forty-six. In those days he became one of the heroes of the younger generation in India.

As he grew older he became less radical, and eventually became a Ghandite. Today, he calls himself a follower of Vinoba Bahave, a bearded aesthetic who wanders about India, and is extremely popular with villagers, who regard him as a wise man

and saint. He preaches the importance of freedom of the soul rather than the importance of political freedom for India.

His follower, Jaya Prakash Narayan, is the political leader of this "for The Good of All" movement.

Incidentally, Narayan is in favor of recognizing the Dalai Lama and the Tibetan Government in exile, and organize all able bodied Tibetans into a guerrilla force that could be sent to harrass the Chinese Reds in Tibet.

His followers believe he will succeed Nehru.

So remember the name - Jaya Prakash Narayan.

Returning from India let's check up on our own defenses. The new Polaris missile, they say, is eighty-five percent new. That much of it's internal mechanism, completely remade since it was developed.
