

STEEL

L.T. - Olds. Tues. Oct. 20 - 59.

A steel strike injunction - requested by the government. A petition filed - at a federal court in Pittsburgh. President Eisenhower arguing - that the ninety-eight day walkout is now a peril to the defense and the space programs of the United States.

The move - opposed, immediately - by the Steel Workers Union. Arguing - that an injunction to send the strikers back to work - would be unconstitutional. The contention being - that the strike does not constitute a danger to national welfare.

According to all precedent, a court order will be granted - suspending the walkout for an eighty-day period. The Union says it will appeal - all the way to the Supreme Court.

CBS
