A revolt in Venezuela - this New Year's

Day. An insurrection - breaking out at the air at
force base Maracay, sixty miles tr om Caracas.
The first word was a government radio
message announcing what it called a "small armed movement," confined entirely to Maracay.

Later the Caracas radio said a rebel airplane
had been shot down over the capital city. Antiaircraft fire was heard - guns blazing away at
rebel jet planes.
A violent way to start the New Year - in that South American republic; 80 rich in treasures of oil. The government, with its royalties from oil -- a multi-multimiliion dollar prize worth fighting for.

The revolt is against President Perez Jiminez, the Venezuelan strong man - who took office five years ago by military decree. Holding power since then - and resorting to a curious form

of election, to legalize his position. Having the Venezuelan Congress enact a law-providing for a presidential plebiscite, instead of a presidential election. The plebiscite held a couple of weeks ago. The people merely voting - whether or not to keep Perez Jiminez in power. "Yes" or "No". About ninety percent - voting "yes".

But that was countered by political
action in New York where exiled Venezuelan political chiefs called the plebiscite a farce - and proclaimed a unification of parties hostile to Perez Jiminez. Tonight, there's a supposition that the present rebellion may be one result of plans worked out by Venezuelan exiles in New York.

In any case, revolt has broken out at
Maracay - an Air Force base. And the question wald seem to be - does the Venezuelan Air Force think it can overthrow the government. Or - are tim other elements of the Venezuelan armed forces involved also i

Year's greetings - to the leadership of Soviet Russia. Replying - to a message from Khrushchev, Bulganin and Vorishilov. The President - expressing earnest wishes for better understanding between East and West.

All of which follows a New Year's party in Moscow last night - where Khrushchev went out of his way to be friendly toward the United States. The big boss of the Kremlin - proposing three toasts. One - to the Soviet Army. Another - to the Socialist countries of the world. In toast number three, Khrushchev raised his glass of champagne - to salute President Eisenhower and the U.S.A.

Khrushchev adding - "If the Soviet Union and the United States can get together and reach agreement, most of the world's problems would be solved."

## PLANE ALBANIA

With a call - for new elections.

An international conference has ended, after setting a record - for long drawn out futility. The inter minable series of meetings, at Geneva - between the U.S. Ambassador to Prague, Alexis Johnson, and Chinese Ambassador Wang Ping Nan. Remember trow long that Has been going al?

Nineteen Fifty -Three, and really got going in August, Nineteen Fifty-Five. Since which time the two Ambassadors have met again and again for "Ambassadorial talks". Seventy-three meetings in two-and-a half years.

release of Americans held prisoners in Red China. There were forty -one to begin with - and six are still in Communist jails. The other topic - a renunciation of warlike measures in the Formosa dispute. The discussions on that point, ending as they began - in a complete stalemate.

Sir edmund Hillary - has run into trouble

But now, a mere hundred miles short of the Pole - they have run into deep snows. Which their traitors are hardly able to get through.
