*For New York City - again - rejection today in Washington. President Ford saying New York officials - "appear to have accepted primary responsibility for solving" their own financial problems; and appear "to be proceeding in the direction - of a long term solution;" but adding he will "await further concrete action" - before deciding next week whether "any legislation is appropriate at the Federal level."*

*The President further saying he will veto, if necessary - the New York "bail-out bill now before the House." That it's "irrelevant - does not address the current situation." He says he is "asking Congress once again to enact special amendments to the Federal bankruptcy law to insure that default, if it occurs would be orderly."*

At Lop Buri in Thailand - a big dance to celebrate Loi Krathong - the festival of lights; when suddenly - a ~~one~~ hand grenade was hurled onto the dance floor. The blast that following killing fourteen young Thais and wounding forty more. ~~Why~~ Why - they haven't been able to figure out, ~~yet~~ - but Communist terrorists are suspected.

BEIRUT

When France's Couve de Murville arrived ~~today~~ in Beirut - where he hopes to serve as a mediator between <sup>the</sup> warring Christians and ~~about~~ Moslems, ~~The difficulty,~~ <sup>what he</sup> ~~of the task he~~ undertakes <sup>was</sup> ~~a few hours later~~ by fierce fighting in eastern Beirut. One of the victims - a British business man said to have been mistaken for an American.

~~At the same time a reminder that Israel - is also vitally concerned with events in Beirut. Four Israeli jets screaming past the Lebanese Presidential palace; then ~~some~~ swooping low over a nearby Palestinian refugee camp - ~~then~~ before heading for home.~~
